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## UNDERSTANDING THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE IN HUMAN GEOGRAPHY

THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE (CMOS) IS A WIDELY RESPECTED AND COMPREHENSIVE STYLE GUIDE THAT PROVIDES EXTENSIVE GUIDANCE ON WRITING, EDITING, AND CITATION. FOR HUMAN GEOGRAPHERS, ADHERING TO CMOS ENSURES A STANDARDIZED AND PROFESSIONAL PRESENTATION OF RESEARCH, FACILITATING CLEAR COMMUNICATION AND ENABLING READERS TO EASILY LOCATE THE SOURCES OF INFORMATION AND ARGUMENTS. THE MANUAL'S FLEXIBILITY ALLOWS FOR ADAPTATION TO VARIOUS ACADEMIC DISCIPLINES, AND ITS DETAILED EXAMPLES ARE PARTICULARLY USEFUL FOR FIELDS LIKE HUMAN GEOGRAPHY, WHICH OFTEN ENGAGE WITH DIVERSE TYPES OF EVIDENCE AND SCHOLARLY MATERIALS.

IN HUMAN GEOGRAPHY, SOURCES CAN RANGE FROM FOUNDATIONAL THEORETICAL TEXTS AND EMPIRICAL STUDIES PUBLISHED IN ACADEMIC JOURNALS TO PRIMARY DATA SUCH AS CENSUS REPORTS, INTERVIEW TRANSCRIPTS, AND GEOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION SYSTEM (GIS) DATASETS. THIS METICULOUS ATTENTION TO DETAIL IS FUNDAMENTAL TO THE SCIENTIFIC AND HUMANISTIC ENDEAVORS INHERENT IN GEOGRAPHICAL INQUIRY.

## THE TWO CITATION SYSTEMS: NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY VS. AUTHOR-DATE

THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE OFFERS TWO DISTINCT CITATION SYSTEMS: THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY (NB) SYSTEM AND THE AUTHOR-DATE (AD) SYSTEM. THE CHOICE BETWEEN THESE TWO OFTEN DEPENDS ON THE CONVENTIONS OF A PARTICULAR

DISCIPLINE OR THE REQUIREMENTS OF A SPECIFIC PUBLISHER OR ACADEMIC INSTITUTION. BOTH SYSTEMS ARE DESIGNED TO PROVIDE COMPREHENSIVE SOURCE ATTRIBUTION, BUT THEY DIFFER IN WHERE AND HOW THE CITATION INFORMATION IS PRESENTED.

THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM IS CHARACTERIZED BY THE USE OF NUMBERED FOOTNOTES OR ENDNOTES TO CITE SOURCES WITHIN THE TEXT, WITH A CORRESPONDING BIBLIOGRAPHY AT THE END OF THE WORK LISTING ALL CITED SOURCES ALPHABETICALLY. THIS SYSTEM IS FREQUENTLY FAVORED IN THE HUMANITIES, INCLUDING HISTORICAL GEOGRAPHY AND CULTURAL GEOGRAPHY. THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, ON THE OTHER HAND, USES PARENTHETICAL IN-TEXT CITATIONS THAT INCLUDE THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE PUBLICATION YEAR, WITH A REFERENCE LIST AT THE END PROVIDING FULL SOURCE DETAILS. THIS SYSTEM IS MORE COMMON IN THE SOCIAL SCIENCES, WHICH MAY ALIGN WITH CERTAIN SUBFIELDS OF HUMAN GEOGRAPHY THAT EMPLOY QUANTITATIVE METHODOLOGIES.

## NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM FOR HUMAN GEOGRAPHY

WHEN EMPLOYING THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM FOR HUMAN GEOGRAPHY RESEARCH, EACH INSTANCE OF QUOTING, PARAPHRASING, OR REFERRING TO ANOTHER SOURCE REQUIRES A CORRESPONDING NOTE. THESE NOTES, PLACED AT THE BOTTOM OF THE PAGE (FOOTNOTES) OR AT THE END OF THE DOCUMENT (ENDNOTES), PROVIDE A SEQUENTIAL NUMBERING THAT LINKS TO THE INFORMATION WITHIN THE TEXT. THE INITIAL NOTE FOR A SOURCE TYPICALLY INCLUDES FULL BIBLIOGRAPHICAL DETAILS, WHILE SUBSEQUENT NOTES FOR THE SAME SOURCE CAN BE ABBREVIATED.

THE BIBLIOGRAPHY AT THE END OF THE WORK SERVES AS A COMPREHENSIVE LIST OF ALL THE SOURCES THAT HAVE BEEN CITED IN THE NOTES. ENTRIES IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHY ARE ALPHABETIZED BY THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND FOLLOW A SPECIFIC FORMAT FOR EACH SOURCE TYPE, SUCH AS BOOKS, JOURNAL ARTICLES, OR EDITED VOLUMES. FOR EXAMPLE, A BOOK ENTRY IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHY WOULD GENERALLY INCLUDE THE AUTHOR'S NAME, THE FULL TITLE OF THE BOOK (ITALICIZED), THE PLACE OF PUBLICATION, THE PUBLISHER, AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION. UNDERSTANDING THESE FORMATTING NUANCES IS CRUCIAL FOR ACCURATE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE HUMAN GEOGRAPHY CITATION USING THIS SYSTEM.

## AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM FOR HUMAN GEOGRAPHY

THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM STREAMLINES IN-TEXT CITATIONS BY PLACING BRIEF REFERENCES DIRECTLY WITHIN THE NARRATIVE. FOR EXAMPLE, A CITATION MIGHT APPEAR AS (SMITH 2020, 45) FOR A DIRECT QUOTE, OR SIMPLY (JONES 2019) WHEN REFERENCING A BROADER IDEA. THIS METHOD ALLOWS READERS TO QUICKLY IDENTIFY THE SOURCE OF INFORMATION WITHOUT INTERRUPTING THE FLOW OF READING WITH EXTENSIVE FOOTNOTES. IT IS PARTICULARLY USEFUL FOR DISCIPLINES THAT PRIORITIZE THE CHRONOLOGICAL PROGRESSION OF IDEAS OR EMPIRICAL FINDINGS.

THE CORRESPONDING REFERENCE LIST, TYPICALLY TITLED "REFERENCES," AT THE END OF THE DOCUMENT PROVIDES THE FULL BIBLIOGRAPHIC INFORMATION FOR EVERY SOURCE CITED IN THE TEXT. UNLIKE THE BIBLIOGRAPHY IN THE NB SYSTEM, THE REFERENCE LIST IN THE AD SYSTEM IS ALSO ALPHABETIZED BY AUTHOR'S LAST NAME BUT FOLLOWS A DISTINCT FORMAT THAT EMPHASIZES THE AUTHOR AND DATE. FOR INSTANCE, A JOURNAL ARTICLE CITATION WOULD TYPICALLY INCLUDE THE AUTHOR'S NAME, THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION IN PARENTHESES, THE ARTICLE TITLE, THE JOURNAL TITLE (ITALICIZED), THE VOLUME AND ISSUE NUMBERS, AND THE PAGE RANGE. THIS STRUCTURE IS FUNDAMENTAL FOR MAINTAINING CLARITY AND CONSISTENCY IN CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE HUMAN GEOGRAPHY CITATION WITHIN THE AD FRAMEWORK.

## CITING CORE HUMAN GEOGRAPHY SOURCES

HUMAN GEOGRAPHY RESEARCH OFTEN DRAWS UPON A VARIETY OF FOUNDATIONAL TEXTS AND SCHOLARLY ARTICLES. ACCURATELY CITING THESE IS PARAMOUNT. WHEN CITING A BOOK, WHETHER IN THE NB OR AD SYSTEM, THE ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS INCLUDE THE AUTHOR'S FULL NAME, THE TITLE OF THE BOOK (ITALICIZED), THE EDITION IF NOT THE FIRST, THE PLACE OF PUBLICATION, THE PUBLISHER, AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION. FOR JOURNAL ARTICLES, THE AUTHOR'S NAME, THE ARTICLE TITLE, THE JOURNAL TITLE (ITALICIZED), THE VOLUME AND ISSUE NUMBERS, AND THE PAGE RANGE ARE CRITICAL.

EDITED VOLUMES PRESENT A SLIGHTLY DIFFERENT CHALLENGE. IF YOU ARE CITING A CHAPTER WITHIN AN EDITED VOLUME, YOU WILL NEED TO INCLUDE THE AUTHOR OF THE CHAPTER, THE CHAPTER TITLE, THE EDITOR(S) OF THE VOLUME, THE TITLE OF THE VOLUME (ITALICIZED), THE PAGE RANGE OF THE CHAPTER, THE PLACE OF PUBLICATION, THE PUBLISHER, AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION. THE SPECIFIC FORMAT IN NOTES AND THE BIBLIOGRAPHY OR REFERENCE LIST WILL VARY SLIGHTLY DEPENDING ON WHICH CMOS SYSTEM IS BEING USED, BUT THE INCLUSION OF ALL THESE DETAILS ENSURES THOROUGH CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE HUMAN GEOGRAPHY CITATION.

## CITING SPATIAL DATA AND MAPS

A UNIQUE ASPECT OF HUMAN GEOGRAPHY IS THE FREQUENT USE OF SPATIAL DATA AND MAPS. CITING THESE SOURCES REQUIRES CAREFUL ATTENTION TO DETAIL TO ACCURATELY REPRESENT THEIR ORIGIN AND CHARACTERISTICS. WHEN CITING A PUBLISHED MAP, YOU SHOULD INCLUDE THE CARTOGRAPHER OR AGENCY RESPONSIBLE, THE TITLE OF THE MAP (ITALICIZED), THE SCALE, THE PLACE OF PUBLICATION, THE PUBLISHER, AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION. IF THE MAP IS PART OF A LARGER WORK, SUCH AS AN ATLAS OR A BOOK, YOU WILL NEED TO INDICATE ITS LOCATION WITHIN THAT WORK.

FOR SPATIAL DATA, SUCH AS DATASETS OBTAINED FROM GOVERNMENT AGENCIES OR RESEARCH INSTITUTIONS, THE CITATION SHOULD INCLUDE THE NAME OF THE DATA CREATOR OR REPOSITORY, THE TITLE OF THE DATASET, THE VERSION OR DATE OF THE DATA, AND THE URL OR ACCESS INFORMATION IF APPLICABLE. FOR EXAMPLE, A CITATION MIGHT LIST THE U.S. CENSUS BUREAU AS THE CREATOR, FOLLOWED BY THE TITLE OF THE DATASET AND ITS ASSOCIATED DOCUMENTATION, ALONG WITH THE DATE OF ACCESS. PROPERLY CITING SPATIAL DATA AND MAPS IS CRUCIAL FOR THE REPRODUCIBILITY OF GEOGRAPHICAL ANALYSIS AND CONTRIBUTES TO THE INTEGRITY OF CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE HUMAN GEOGRAPHY CITATION FOR THESE SPECIFIC RESOURCES.

## CITING DIGITAL AND ONLINE GEOGRAPHICAL RESOURCES

THE DIGITAL REALM OFFERS A VAST ARRAY OF RESOURCES FOR HUMAN GEOGRAPHERS, FROM ONLINE ENCYCLOPEDIAS AND DATABASES TO DIGITAL ARCHIVES AND INTERACTIVE MAPS. CITING THESE ONLINE RESOURCES REQUIRES CAREFUL CONSIDERATION OF THE ELEMENTS THAT CONTRIBUTE TO THEIR RETRIEVABILITY AND CREDIBILITY. GENERALLY, YOU SHOULD INCLUDE THE AUTHOR OR ORGANIZATION RESPONSIBLE, THE TITLE OF THE SPECIFIC PAGE OR RESOURCE, THE NAME OF THE WEBSITE (ITALICIZED IF IT FUNCTIONS AS A PUBLICATION), THE PUBLICATION OR UPDATE DATE IF AVAILABLE, AND THE URL. IT IS ALSO OFTEN RECOMMENDED TO INCLUDE A DATE OF ACCESS, ESPECIALLY FOR RESOURCES THAT MAY CHANGE OVER TIME.

WHEN CITING ONLINE JOURNALS OR ARTICLES, FOLLOW THE STANDARD GUIDELINES FOR JOURNAL ARTICLES BUT INCLUDE THE DOI (DIGITAL OBJECT IDENTIFIER) IF AVAILABLE, OR THE URL. FOR WEBSITES THAT ACT AS PRIMARY SOURCES OF GEOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION, SUCH AS THOSE FROM NATIONAL MAPPING AGENCIES OR STATISTICAL OFFICES, ENSURE YOU CAPTURE THE MOST SPECIFIC INFORMATION POSSIBLE. THE PRINCIPLES OF CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE HUMAN GEOGRAPHY CITATION FOR DIGITAL RESOURCES ARE DESIGNED TO ENSURE THAT READERS CAN RELIABLY LOCATE AND VERIFY THE INFORMATION, EVEN AS THE DIGITAL LANDSCAPE EVOLVES.

## COMMON CHALLENGES IN HUMAN GEOGRAPHY CITATIONS

HUMAN GEOGRAPHERS OFTEN ENCOUNTER SPECIFIC CHALLENGES WHEN APPLYING CITATION STYLES. ONE COMMON ISSUE IS THE CITATION OF PRIMARY DATA SOURCES, SUCH AS QUALITATIVE INTERVIEWS OR FIELD NOTES. THESE REQUIRE CAREFUL DOCUMENTATION OF WHO WAS INTERVIEWED, WHEN, WHERE, AND UNDER WHAT CONDITIONS, ALONG WITH PROPER ANONYMIZATION IF NECESSARY. ANOTHER CHALLENGE ARISES WITH THE CITATION OF GEOGRAPHICAL SOFTWARE AND COMPLEX DATASETS, WHICH MAY NOT HAVE TRADITIONAL AUTHOR-TITLE STRUCTURES.

THE EPHEMERAL NATURE OF SOME ONLINE RESOURCES, SUCH AS WEB PAGES THAT ARE FREQUENTLY UPDATED OR REMOVED, CAN ALSO POSE DIFFICULTIES. ENSURING THAT A CITATION REMAINS VALID OVER TIME REQUIRES METICULOUS RECORD-KEEPING AND THE INCLUSION OF ACCESS DATES. FURTHERMORE, THE INTERDISCIPLINARY NATURE OF HUMAN GEOGRAPHY MEANS ENGAGING WITH SOURCES THAT MAY USE DIFFERENT CITATION CONVENTIONS. NAVIGATING THESE COMPLEXITIES REQUIRES A THOROUGH UNDERSTANDING OF CMOS AND A COMMITMENT TO CONSISTENT APPLICATION FOR ACCURATE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE HUMAN GEOGRAPHY CITATION.

## BEST PRACTICES FOR CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE HUMAN GEOGRAPHY CITATION

TO ENSURE ACCURATE AND CONSISTENT CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE HUMAN GEOGRAPHY CITATION, SEVERAL BEST PRACTICES SHOULD BE ADOPTED. THIRD, WHEN CITING, ALWAYS STRIVE FOR CLARITY AND COMPLETENESS. ENSURE THAT ALL NECESSARY BIBLIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION IS INCLUDED FOR EACH SOURCE TYPE. FOURTH, BE CONSISTENT IN YOUR APPLICATION OF EITHER THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY OR AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM THROUGHOUT YOUR ENTIRE WORK. FINALLY, IF YOU ARE UNSURE ABOUT A SPECIFIC CITATION SCENARIO, CONSULT CMOS DIRECTLY OR SEEK GUIDANCE FROM YOUR INSTRUCTOR, EDITOR, OR A PROFESSIONAL WRITING CENTER. ADHERING TO THESE PRACTICES WILL ELEVATE THE SCHOLARLY RIGOR OF YOUR HUMAN GEOGRAPHY RESEARCH.

## FAQ

### **Q: WHAT IS THE PRIMARY DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY AND AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEMS IN CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE FOR HUMAN GEOGRAPHY?**

### **Q: WHEN WOULD A HUMAN GEOGRAPHER TYPICALLY CHOOSE THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM OVER THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM?**

A: HUMAN GEOGRAPHERS, PARTICULARLY THOSE IN SUBFIELDS LIKE HISTORICAL GEOGRAPHY OR CULTURAL GEOGRAPHY THAT OFTEN ENGAGE WITH EXTENSIVE ARCHIVAL RESEARCH AND DETAILED HISTORICAL NARRATIVES, MIGHT FAVOR THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM. THIS SYSTEM IS ALSO PREVALENT IN FIELDS THAT PRIORITIZE DETAILED SOURCE COMMENTARY ALONGSIDE THE MAIN TEXT.

### **Q: HOW SHOULD I CITE A GEOGRAPHICAL DATASET IN CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE?**

A: CITING GEOGRAPHICAL DATASETS INVOLVES IDENTIFYING THE CREATOR OR REPOSITORY OF THE DATA, THE TITLE OF THE DATASET, ITS VERSION OR DATE, AND ANY RELEVANT ACCESS INFORMATION SUCH AS A URL OR DOI. FOR EXAMPLE: U.S. CENSUS BUREAU. "AMERICAN COMMUNITY SURVEY 2022." ACCESSED DECEMBER 10, 2023. [URL].

### **Q: WHAT ARE THE KEY ELEMENTS TO INCLUDE WHEN CITING A JOURNAL ARTICLE IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM FOR HUMAN GEOGRAPHY?**

A: IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, CITING A JOURNAL ARTICLE INVOLVES THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND YEAR IN THE TEXT (E.G., SMITH 2021). IN THE REFERENCE LIST, IT INCLUDES THE AUTHOR'S NAME, THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION IN PARENTHESES, THE ARTICLE TITLE, THE JOURNAL TITLE (ITALICIZED), THE VOLUME AND ISSUE NUMBERS, AND THE PAGE RANGE.

### **Q: IS IT NECESSARY TO CITE ONLINE MAPS OR GIS LAYERS?**

A: YES, IT IS ESSENTIAL TO CITE ONLINE MAPS AND GIS LAYERS JUST AS YOU WOULD ANY OTHER SOURCE. THE CITATION SHOULD INCLUDE THE CREATOR OR PROVIDER OF THE MAP/LAYER, ITS TITLE, THE DATE OF CREATION OR LAST UPDATE, AND THE URL OR ACCESS METHOD.

### **Q: HOW DO I CITE A CHAPTER IN AN EDITED BOOK ABOUT HUMAN GEOGRAPHY USING THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM?**

A: IN A FOOTNOTE OR ENDNOTE, YOU WOULD PROVIDE THE CHAPTER AUTHOR'S NAME, THE CHAPTER TITLE, THE EDITORS OF THE BOOK, THE BOOK TITLE (ITALICIZED), THE PAGE RANGE OF THE CHAPTER, THE PLACE OF PUBLICATION, PUBLISHER, AND YEAR. IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHY, THE FORMAT IS SIMILAR BUT OFTEN SLIGHTLY ALTERED FOR FLOW.

## **Q: WHAT SHOULD I DO IF A WEBSITE I AM CITING FOR HUMAN GEOGRAPHY INFORMATION HAS NO CLEAR PUBLICATION DATE?**

A: IF A WEBSITE HAS NO PUBLICATION OR UPDATE DATE, YOU SHOULD INDICATE THIS BY WRITING "N.D." (FOR NO DATE) IN PLACE OF THE DATE. IT IS ALSO HIGHLY RECOMMENDED TO INCLUDE THE DATE YOU ACCESSED THE INFORMATION, AS WEB CONTENT CAN CHANGE FREQUENTLY.

## **Q: CAN I USE CITATION MANAGEMENT SOFTWARE WITH THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE FOR MY HUMAN GEOGRAPHY RESEARCH?**

A: ABSOLUTELY. THIS CAN SIGNIFICANTLY STREAMLINE THE PROCESS OF ORGANIZING YOUR SOURCES AND GENERATING BIBLIOGRAPHIES.

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
