MASTERING CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE QUOTING THESES

CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE QUOTING THESES IS A CRITICAL SKILL FOR ANY ACADEMIC WRITER AIMING FOR CLARITY, CREDIBILITY, AND ADHERENCE TO SCHOLARLY CONVENTIONS. PROPERLY CITING AND INTEGRATING QUOTATIONS FROM SOURCES WITHIN A THESIS OR DISSERTATION NOT ONLY DEMONSTRATES THOROUGH RESEARCH BUT ALSO STRENGTHENS YOUR ARGUMENTS AND ACKNOWLEDGES THE INTELLECTUAL CONTRIBUTIONS OF OTHERS. THIS GUIDE DELVES INTO THE INTRICACIES OF APPLYING THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE (CMOS) FOR QUOTING, EXPLORING BOTH ITS AUTHOR-DATE AND NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEMS, AND OFFERING PRACTICAL ADVICE FOR SEAMLESS INTEGRATION AND ACCURATE ATTRIBUTION WITHIN THE CONTEXT OF THESIS WRITING. UNDERSTANDING THESE GUIDELINES ENSURES YOUR WORK MEETS THE RIGOROUS STANDARDS EXPECTED IN ACADEMIC PUBLISHING AND RESEARCH.

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UNDERSTANDING THE TWO CHICAGO STYLE SYSTEMS FOR THESES

THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE PRESENTS TWO DISTINCT CITATION SYSTEMS, AND UNDERSTANDING WHICH ONE IS APPROPRIATE FOR YOUR THESIS IS THE CRUCIAL FIRST STEP. WHILE BOTH SYSTEMS ENSURE ACADEMIC INTEGRITY, THEY DIFFER IN THEIR PRESENTATION OF SOURCE INFORMATION. MOST HUMANITIES AND SOME SOCIAL SCIENCE DISCIPLINES PREFER THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, WHICH USES FOOTNOTES OR ENDNOTES FOR CITATIONS AND A BIBLIOGRAPHY AT THE END OF THE WORK. CONVERSELY, MANY SCIENCES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES OPT FOR THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, WHICH INCORPORATES IN-TEXT CITATIONS CONSISTING OF THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE PUBLICATION YEAR, SUPPORTED BY A REFERENCE LIST. WHEN WRITING A THESIS, IT IS IMPERATIVE TO ASCERTAIN THE SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS OF YOUR DEPARTMENT OR INSTITUTION, AS THEY OFTEN DICTATE THE PREFERRED CITATION STYLE.

THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM FOR THESES

THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, OFTEN FAVORED IN DISCIPLINES LIKE LITERATURE, HISTORY, AND ART HISTORY, RELIES ON SUPERSCRIPTS WITHIN THE TEXT TO INDICATE A NOTE. THESE NOTES, LOCATED AT THE BOTTOM OF THE PAGE (FOOTNOTES) OR AT THE END OF THE CHAPTER OR DOCUMENT (ENDNOTES), PROVIDE THE FULL CITATION DETAILS. A COMPREHENSIVE BIBLIOGRAPHY FOLLOWS, LISTING ALL CONSULTED SOURCES ALPHABETICALLY. THIS SYSTEM ALLOWS FOR EXTENSIVE EXPLANATORY NOTES AND DETAILED SOURCE INFORMATION WITHOUT DISRUPTING THE FLOW OF THE MAIN TEXT, MAKING IT IDEAL FOR NUANCED ARGUMENTS AND EXTENSIVE HISTORICAL OR CRITICAL ANALYSIS WITHIN A THESIS.

THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM FOR THESES

THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, PREVALENT IN FIELDS SUCH AS SOCIOLOGY, POLITICAL SCIENCE, AND PSYCHOLOGY, USES BRIEF IN-TEXT CITATIONS. EACH QUOTATION OR PARAPHRASED IDEA IS FOLLOWED BY THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION, OFTEN WITH A PAGE NUMBER FOR DIRECT QUOTES (E.G., SMITH 2020, 45). THIS METHOD OFFERS A CONCISE WAY TO ATTRIBUTE SOURCES DIRECTLY WITHIN THE NARRATIVE. THE CORRESPONDING REFERENCE LIST AT THE END OF THE THESIS PROVIDES FULL PUBLICATION DETAILS FOR ALL CITED WORKS. THIS SYSTEM IS EFFICIENT FOR PRESENTING EMPIRICAL DATA AND RESEARCH FINDINGS, WHERE RAPID IDENTIFICATION OF THE SOURCE'S ORIGIN IS PARAMOUNT.

DIRECT QUOTATIONS: RULES AND EXAMPLES

DIRECT QUOTATIONS INVOLVE USING THE EXACT WORDS FROM A SOURCE. THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE PROVIDES PRECISE GUIDELINES FOR THEIR INCLUSION AND FORMATTING TO MAINTAIN ACCURACY AND AVOID PLAGIARISM. WHEN QUOTING DIRECTLY, IT IS ESSENTIAL TO ENSURE THAT THE QUOTED TEXT IS IDENTICAL TO THE ORIGINAL, INCLUDING PUNCTUATION AND SPELLING.

ANY DEVIATIONS MUST BE EXPLICITLY INDICATED. THE GOAL IS TO INTEGRATE THESE VERBATIM EXCERPTS SEAMLESSLY INTO YOUR OWN PROSE, USING THEM TO SUPPORT YOUR CLAIMS OR ILLUSTRATE A POINT.

INTEGRATING SHORT QUOTATIONS

SHORT DIRECT QUOTATIONS, TYPICALLY FEWER THAN 40 WORDS, ARE USUALLY INCORPORATED DIRECTLY INTO THE TEXT, ENCLOSED IN DOUBLE QUOTATION MARKS. THE QUOTATION SHOULD FLOW NATURALLY WITHIN YOUR SENTENCE. FOR EXAMPLE, WHEN DISCUSSING A SEMINAL THEORY, YOU MIGHT WRITE: AS RENOWNED SOCIOLOGIST ERVING GOFFMAN ARGUED, "THE WORLD, IN SHORT, BECOMES A STAGE, AND WE ARE ALL ACTORS PLAYING OUR ASSIGNED ROLES" (GOFFMAN 1959, 25). NOTICE HOW THE QUOTATION IS INTEGRATED AND FOLLOWED BY THE CITATION.

FORMATTING BLOCK QUOTATIONS

FOR LONGER QUOTATIONS, GENERALLY EXCEEDING 40 WORDS, CHICAGO STYLE DICTATES THE USE OF A BLOCK QUOTATION FORMAT. THIS MEANS THE QUOTED MATERIAL IS PRESENTED AS A SEPARATE, INDENTED PARAGRAPH, WITHOUT QUOTATION MARKS. THE ENTIRE BLOCK IS TYPICALLY INDENTED FROM THE LEFT MARGIN, AND THE CITATION FOLLOWS THE FINAL PUNCTUATION OF THE QUOTE. FOR INSTANCE, A LENGTHY PASSAGE FROM A HISTORICAL DOCUMENT MIGHT APPEAR LIKE THIS:

THE DECLARATION STATED:

"WE HOLD THESE TRUTHS TO BE SELF-EVIDENT, THAT ALL MEN ARE CREATED EQUAL, THAT THEY ARE ENDOWED BY THEIR CREATOR WITH CERTAIN UNALIENABLE RIGHTS, THAT AMONG THESE ARE LIFE, LIBERTY AND THE PURSUIT OF HAPPINESS.--THAT TO SECURE THESE RIGHTS, GOVERNMENTS ARE INSTITUTED AMONG MEN, DERIVING THEIR JUST POWERS FROM THE CONSENT OF THE GOVERNED" (JEFFERSON 1776, 1).

THIS DISTINCT FORMATTING VISUALLY SEPARATES THE AUTHOR'S WORDS FROM YOUR OWN ANALYSIS, DRAWING ATTENTION TO THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE EXTENDED PASSAGE.

INDIRECT QUOTATIONS (PARAPHRASING AND SUMMARIZING)

INDIRECT QUOTATIONS, WHICH INCLUDE PARAPHRASES AND SUMMARIES, INVOLVE RESTATING THE IDEAS OF ANOTHER AUTHOR IN YOUR OWN WORDS. WHILE YOU ARE NOT USING THE ORIGINAL WORDING, YOU ARE STILL REQUIRED TO PROVIDE A CITATION. THIS IS CRUCIAL FOR GIVING CREDIT TO THE ORIGINAL SOURCE AND ALLOWING YOUR READERS TO LOCATE THE INFORMATION IF THEY WISH. PROPER PARAPHRASING DEMONSTRATES YOUR UNDERSTANDING OF THE SOURCE MATERIAL AND YOUR ABILITY TO SYNTHESIZE IT INTO YOUR OWN ARGUMENT.

THE ART OF PARAPHRASING

PARAPHRASING INVOLVES REPHRASING A SPECIFIC PASSAGE OR IDEA FROM A SOURCE USING YOUR OWN VOCABULARY AND SENTENCE STRUCTURE, WHILE RETAINING THE ORIGINAL MEANING. A GOOD PARAPHRASE ACCURATELY REFLECTS THE ORIGINAL CONTENT WITHOUT SOUNDING LIKE A WORD-FOR-WORD REWRITE. FOR EXAMPLE, INSTEAD OF QUOTING DIRECTLY, YOU MIGHT PARAPHRASE A STATEMENT ON SOCIAL STRATIFICATION BY WRITING: GOFFMAN (1959) CONCEPTUALIZED SOCIAL INTERACTION AS THEATRICAL, WHERE INDIVIDUALS PERFORM ROLES TO MANAGE IMPRESSIONS, AKIN TO ACTORS ON A STAGE. THIS CONVEYS THE SAME IDEA CONCISELY AND IN YOUR OWN VOICE.

EFFECTIVE SUMMARIZING TECHNIQUES

SUMMARIZING INVOLVES CONDENSING THE MAIN POINTS OF A LARGER SECTION OF TEXT, SUCH AS A CHAPTER OR AN ENTIRE ARTICLE, INTO A SHORTER OVERVIEW. A SUMMARY SHOULD CAPTURE THE ESSENCE OF THE ORIGINAL WORK WITHOUT DELVING INTO MINOR DETAILS. WHEN SUMMARIZING A SOURCE FOR YOUR THESIS, FOCUS ON THE KEY ARGUMENTS AND FINDINGS THAT ARE RELEVANT TO YOUR RESEARCH. FOR INSTANCE, YOU MIGHT SUMMARIZE A COMPLEX THEORETICAL FRAMEWORK BY STATING: FOUCAULT'S (1975) ANALYSIS OF POWER DYNAMICS REVEALS HOW DISCIPLINARY INSTITUTIONS SHAPE INDIVIDUALS THROUGH SURVEILLANCE AND NORMALIZATION, CREATING A PERVERSIVE SENSE OF BEING WATCHED THAT INTERNALIZES CONTROL. THIS DISTILLS A SUBSTANTIAL BODY OF WORK INTO A SINGLE, CITABLE SENTENCE.

INCORPORATING QUOTED MATERIAL EFFECTIVELY

SIMPLY DROPPING QUOTATIONS INTO YOUR THESIS WITHOUT PROPER INTEGRATION WEAKENS YOUR ARGUMENT AND CAN MAKE YOUR WRITING APPEAR DISJOINTED. EFFECTIVE INCORPORATION INVOLVES CAREFULLY WEAVING QUOTED MATERIAL INTO YOUR OWN SENTENCES AND PARAGRAPHS, ENSURING IT SERVES A CLEAR PURPOSE. THINK OF QUOTATIONS AS EVIDENCE TO SUPPORT

YOUR CLAIMS, NOT AS REPLACEMENTS FOR YOUR OWN ANALYSIS.

INTRODUCING AND EXPLAINING QUOTES

EACH QUOTATION, WHETHER DIRECT OR INDIRECT, SHOULD BE INTRODUCED WITH A SIGNAL PHRASE THAT IDENTIFIES THE SOURCE OR THE IDEA BEING PRESENTED. FOLLOWING THE QUOTATION, YOU MUST PROVIDE AN EXPLANATION OR ANALYSIS THAT CLARIFIES ITS RELEVANCE TO YOUR THESIS. THIS SHOWS YOUR READER HOW THE QUOTE SUPPORTS YOUR ARGUMENT. FOR EXAMPLE, "SMITH (2018) OBSERVES THAT 'THE ECONOMIC DOWNTURN DISPROPORTIONATELY AFFECTED MARGINALIZED COMMUNITIES' (P. 78). THIS FINDING IS CRITICAL TO UNDERSTANDING THE PERSISTENT INEQUALITIES THAT MY RESEARCH ADDRESSES."

MAINTAINING FLOW AND COHESION

THE GOAL IS TO MAKE THE QUOTATION FEEL LIKE A NATURAL EXTENSION OF YOUR OWN WRITING. AVOID ABRUPT TRANSITIONS. USE TRANSITION WORDS AND PHRASES TO CONNECT YOUR OWN IDEAS TO THE QUOTED MATERIAL AND TO LINK THE EXPLANATION BACK TO YOUR OVERALL ARGUMENT. THE SURROUNDING TEXT SHOULD LEAD INTO THE QUOTE AND THEN FOLLOW UP ON ITS SIGNIFICANCE, CREATING A SMOOTH AND COHERENT NARRATIVE.

BLOCK QUOTATIONS: FORMATTING FOR EXTENDED PASSAGES

AS PREVIOUSLY MENTIONED, LONGER QUOTATIONS REQUIRE SPECIAL FORMATTING TO DISTINGUISH THEM FROM YOUR OWN PROSE. THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE PROVIDES CLEAR RULES FOR PRESENTING THESE BLOCK QUOTATIONS, ENSURING CLARITY AND VISUAL APPEAL. ADHERING TO THESE FORMATTING GUIDELINES IS ESSENTIAL FOR MAINTAINING A PROFESSIONAL AND ACADEMIC PRESENTATION OF YOUR THESIS.

INDENTATION AND PUNCTUATION

BLOCK QUOTATIONS ARE SET OFF FROM THE MAIN TEXT BY INDENTING THEM ONE-HALF INCH FROM THE LEFT MARGIN. THE ENTIRE BLOCK OF QUOTED TEXT IS INDENTED, AND IT DOES NOT USE QUOTATION MARKS. THE CITATION, WHETHER IN NOTES OR AUTHOR-DATE FORMAT, TYPICALLY FOLLOWS THE TERMINAL PUNCTUATION OF THE QUOTATION. FOR THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, IT WOULD BE A SUPERSCRIT NOTE NUMBER AFTER THE PUNCTUATION. FOR THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, IT WOULD BE (AUTHOR YEAR, PAGE).

WHEN TO USE BLOCK QUOTATIONS

BLOCK QUOTATIONS ARE RESERVED FOR PASSAGES THAT ARE PARTICULARLY SIGNIFICANT, LENGTHY, OR REQUIRE CAREFUL EXAMINATION OF THEIR PRECISE WORDING. USING THEM TOO FREQUENTLY CAN DISRUPT THE FLOW OF YOUR WRITING AND MAKE YOUR THESIS APPEAR TO BE A COMPILATION OF OTHERS' WORK RATHER THAN YOUR OWN ORIGINAL CONTRIBUTION. CONSIDER WHETHER A SHORTER QUOTATION OR A PARAPHRASE WOULD SUFFICE BEFORE OPTING FOR A BLOCK QUOTE.

CITING SOURCES WITHIN YOUR THESIS

ACCURATE AND CONSISTENT CITATION IS THE CORNERSTONE OF ACADEMIC INTEGRITY AND IS NON-NEGOTIABLE WHEN QUOTING MATERIAL FOR YOUR THESIS. THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE OFFERS SPECIFIC FORMATS FOR BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRIES AND IN-TEXT CITATIONS, DEPENDING ON THE SYSTEM YOU EMPLOY. DILIGENCE IN THIS AREA PREVENTS ACCUSATIONS OF PLAGIARISM AND ALLOWS READERS TO VERIFY YOUR SOURCES.

BUILDING YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY OR REFERENCE LIST

WHETHER USING THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY OR AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, A COMPREHENSIVE LIST OF ALL CONSULTED SOURCES MUST BE PROVIDED. FOR THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, THIS IS A "BIBLIOGRAPHY." FOR THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, IT IS A "REFERENCE LIST." EACH ENTRY SHOULD INCLUDE ALL NECESSARY PUBLICATION DETAILS, SUCH AS AUTHOR, TITLE, PUBLISHER, AND DATE, FORMATTED ACCORDING TO CMOS GUIDELINES.

IN-TEXT CITATION DETAILS

IN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, EACH QUOTATION OR PARAPHRASED IDEA IS ACCOMPANIED BY A SUPERSCRIT NUMBER THAT CORRESPONDS TO A FOOTNOTE OR ENDNOTE. THESE NOTES PROVIDE THE FULL CITATION INFORMATION. IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, THE IN-TEXT CITATION IS BRIEF, TYPICALLY INCLUDING THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME, YEAR, AND PAGE NUMBER (E.G.,

(AUTHOR YEAR, PAGE)). ENSURE CONSISTENCY IN THE LEVEL OF DETAIL PROVIDED IN YOUR IN-TEXT CITATIONS.

COMMON CHALLENGES AND SOLUTIONS IN QUOTING THESES

NAVIGATING THE COMPLEXITIES OF QUOTING IN ACADEMIC WRITING CAN PRESENT CHALLENGES. COMMON PITFALLS INCLUDE MISINTERPRETING QUOTATION MARKS, INCORRECT INDENTATION, AND INCONSISTENT CITATION PRACTICES. RECOGNIZING THESE POTENTIAL ISSUES AND KNOWING HOW TO ADDRESS THEM WILL ENSURE YOUR THESIS ADHERES TO CMOS STANDARDS.

HANDLING PUNCTUATION WITH QUOTATIONS

PUNCTUATION CAN BE TRICKY WITH QUOTATIONS. IN AMERICAN ENGLISH, PERIODS AND COMMAS GENERALLY PRECEDE CLOSING QUOTATION MARKS. IF THE QUOTATION ENDS A SENTENCE AND THE PUNCTUATION IS NOT PART OF THE QUOTE ITSELF, IT GOES OUTSIDE THE CLOSING QUOTATION MARK. FOR EXAMPLE: HE ASKED, "ARE YOU COMING?" OR SHE STATED THAT SHE WAS "READY TO PROCEED."

ENSURING CITATION ACCURACY

ACCURACY IN CITATION IS PARAMOUNT. DOUBLE-CHECK EVERY DETAIL AGAINST THE ORIGINAL SOURCE AND THE CMOS GUIDELINES. ERRORS IN PAGE NUMBERS, AUTHOR NAMES, OR PUBLICATION YEARS CAN UNDERMINE YOUR CREDIBILITY. IF YOU ARE UNSURE ABOUT A SPECIFIC CITATION FORMAT, CONSULT THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE OR YOUR THESIS ADVISOR.

FINAL CONSIDERATIONS FOR CMOS QUOTING

THE APPLICATION OF THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE FOR QUOTING THESES REQUIRES METICULOUS ATTENTION TO DETAIL AND A THOROUGH UNDERSTANDING OF ITS PRINCIPLES. ETHICAL USE OF QUOTATIONS

ETHICAL QUOTING INVOLVES USING SOURCES HONESTLY AND ACCURATELY. NEVER DISTORT THE MEANING OF A QUOTATION TO FIT YOUR ARGUMENT. ENSURE THAT YOUR USE OF QUOTATIONS ACCURATELY REFLECTS THE AUTHOR'S INTENT AND CONTEXT. PROPER ATTRIBUTION IS NOT JUST A STYLISTIC REQUIREMENT; IT IS AN ETHICAL IMPERATIVE THAT UPHOLDS ACADEMIC INTEGRITY.

PROOFREADING AND REVISION

BEFORE SUBMITTING YOUR THESIS, CONDUCT A THOROUGH PROOFREAD SPECIFICALLY FOR QUOTATION AND CITATION ERRORS. ENSURE ALL QUOTATIONS ARE CORRECTLY FORMATTED, ACCURATELY TRANSCRIBED, AND CONSISTENTLY CITED ACCORDING TO YOUR CHOSEN CMOS SYSTEM. Q: WHAT IS THE PRIMARY DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE TWO CHICAGO STYLE CITATION SYSTEMS FOR THESES?

A: YOU SHOULD USE A BLOCK QUOTATION FOR DIRECT QUOTES THAT ARE LONGER THAN 40 WORDS. THIS FORMATTING VISUALLY SEPARATES EXTENDED PASSAGES OF QUOTED MATERIAL FROM YOUR OWN TEXT, REQUIRING INDENTATION AND OMITTING QUOTATION MARKS.

Q: HOW DO I CITE A SOURCE I AM PARAPHRASING OR SUMMARIZING IN MY THESIS USING CHICAGO STYLE?

A: EVEN WHEN PARAPHRASING OR SUMMARIZING, YOU MUST CITE THE ORIGINAL SOURCE. FOR THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, THIS WILL APPEAR IN A FOOTNOTE OR ENDNOTE. FOR THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, AN IN-TEXT CITATION WITH THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND PUBLICATION YEAR (E.G., SMITH 2020) IS REQUIRED, OFTEN WITH A PAGE NUMBER IF REFERENCING A SPECIFIC

IDEA.

Q: WHAT ARE THE RULES FOR INCORPORATING PUNCTUATION WITH DIRECT QUOTATIONS IN A THESIS UNDER CHICAGO STYLE?

A: IN AMERICAN ENGLISH, PERIODS AND COMMAS GENERALLY GO INSIDE THE CLOSING QUOTATION MARKS. OTHER PUNCTUATION (COLONS, SEMICOLONS, QUESTION MARKS, EXCLAMATION POINTS) ARE PLACED INSIDE ONLY IF THEY ARE PART OF THE QUOTED MATERIAL. IF THE PUNCTUATION IS NOT PART OF THE QUOTE BUT ENDS THE SENTENCE, IT GOES OUTSIDE THE QUOTATION MARKS.

Q: HOW DO I ENSURE MY THESIS ADHERES TO CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE QUOTING GUIDELINES FOR A RESEARCH PAPER?

A: TO ENSURE ADHERENCE, METICULOUSLY REVIEW THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE FOR SPECIFIC RULES ON DIRECT AND INDIRECT QUOTATIONS, BLOCK QUOTES, AND CITATION FORMATTING (NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY OR AUTHOR-DATE). CONSISTENT APPLICATION, CAREFUL PROOFREADING, AND CONSULTING YOUR ADVISOR FOR DEPARTMENTAL PREFERENCES ARE KEY STEPS.

Q: IS IT NECESSARY TO INCLUDE PAGE NUMBERS IN ALL IN-TEXT CITATIONS FOR A THESIS USING THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE?

A: PAGE NUMBERS ARE GENERALLY REQUIRED FOR DIRECT QUOTATIONS IN BOTH THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY AND AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEMS. FOR PARAPHRASES OR SUMMARIES, PAGE NUMBERS ARE OFTEN OPTIONAL BUT ARE RECOMMENDED IF YOU ARE REFERENCING A SPECIFIC IDEA OR SECTION FROM A SOURCE.

Q: WHAT IS THE BEST WAY TO INTRODUCE A QUOTATION IN MY THESIS WHEN USING CHICAGO STYLE?

A: INTRODUCE QUOTATIONS WITH A SIGNAL PHRASE THAT CLEARLY IDENTIFIES THE SOURCE OR THE CONTEXT OF THE QUOTE. FOR EXAMPLE, "ACCORDING TO DR. JONES (2021), '...' " OR "AS DISCUSSED BY THE AUTHOR, THE PHENOMENON IS CHARACTERIZED BY..." FOLLOWED BY THE QUOTATION AND ITS CITATION.

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
