UNDERSTANDING CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE FOR WEBSITES

CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR DATE FOR WEBSITES IS A CRITICAL ASPECT OF ACADEMIC AND PROFESSIONAL WRITING THAT ENSURES PROPER ATTRIBUTION AND AVOIDS PLAGIARISM. THIS CITATION STYLE, OFTEN USED IN THE SCIENCES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES, OFFERS A CLEAR AND CONCISE METHOD FOR REFERENCING SOURCES DIRECTLY WITHIN THE TEXT, FOLLOWED BY A COMPREHENSIVE BIBLIOGRAPHY. NAVIGATING ITS NUANCES, PARTICULARLY FOR DIGITAL CONTENT, CAN SOMETIMES BE CHALLENGING. THIS ARTICLE WILL DELVE INTO THE INTRICACIES OF IMPLEMENTING THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM FOR WEBSITES, COVERING EVERYTHING FROM IN-TEXT CITATIONS AND FULL BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRIES TO SPECIFIC CONSIDERATIONS FOR VARIOUS ONLINE CONTENT TYPES. UNDERSTANDING THESE ELEMENTS IS PARAMOUNT FOR PRODUCING CREDIBLE AND ETHICALLY SOUND RESEARCH.

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WHY USE CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE?

THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE (CMOS) OFFERS TWO PRIMARY CITATION SYSTEMS: NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY AND AUTHOR-DATE. THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM IS FAVORED IN DISCIPLINES WHERE BREVITY AND DIRECT ACCESS TO SOURCE INFORMATION ARE PARAMOUNT. ITS PRIMARY ADVANTAGE LIES IN ITS STRAIGHTFORWARDNESS; READERS CAN QUICKLY IDENTIFY THE SOURCE OF INFORMATION WITHIN THE TEXT AND THEN LOCATE THE FULL CITATION IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHY. THIS SYSTEM IS PARTICULARLY BENEFICIAL FOR ARTICLES, RESEARCH PAPERS, AND DISSERTATIONS WHERE A CLEAR AND EFFICIENT METHOD OF REFERENCING IS CRUCIAL FOR MAINTAINING ACADEMIC INTEGRITY AND FACILITATING READER COMPREHENSION.

EMPLOYING THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE STYLE FOR WEBSITES SPECIFICALLY ADDRESSES THE UNIQUE CHALLENGES OF CITING ONLINE CONTENT. UNLIKE TRADITIONAL PRINT SOURCES, WEBSITES CAN BE MORE FLUID, WITH AUTHORS, DATES, AND EVEN CONTENT CHANGING OVER TIME. THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM PROVIDES A ROBUST FRAMEWORK FOR HANDLING THESE VARIATIONS, ENSURING THAT READERS CAN ACCURATELY TRACE THE INFORMATION BACK TO ITS ORIGIN, EVEN WITH THE EPHEMERAL NATURE OF SOME WEB CONTENT. THIS CONSISTENT APPROACH BUILDS CREDIBILITY AND DEMONSTRATES A COMMITMENT TO SCHOLARLY RIGOR.

IN-TEXT CITATIONS IN CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE FOR WEBSITES

IN-TEXT CITATIONS ARE THE CORNERSTONE OF THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM. THEY PROVIDE IMMEDIATE EVIDENCE OF

WHERE SPECIFIC INFORMATION, IDEAS, OR QUOTES HAVE BEEN DRAWN FROM WITHIN YOUR OWN TEXT. FOR WEBSITES, THESE CITATIONS ARE TYPICALLY PLACED IN PARENTHESES AND APPEAR AT THE END OF A SENTENCE OR CLAUSE, JUST BEFORE THE FINAL PUNCTUATION MARK. THE FORMAT IS DESIGNED TO BE AS UNOBTRUSIVE AS POSSIBLE WHILE STILL CONVEYING ALL NECESSARY IDENTIFYING INFORMATION FOR THE SOURCE.

BASIC AUTHOR-DATE CITATION FORMAT

THE MOST FUNDAMENTAL FORMAT FOR AN IN-TEXT CITATION IN CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE INVOLVES THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION. FOR EXAMPLE, IF YOU ARE CITING INFORMATION FROM A WEBPAGE AUTHORED BY JOHN SMITH AND PUBLISHED IN 2023, THE IN-TEXT CITATION WOULD APPEAR AS (SMITH 2023).

IF THE AUTHOR'S NAME IS ALREADY MENTIONED IN THE SENTENCE, YOU ONLY NEED TO INCLUDE THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION IN PARENTHESES. FOR INSTANCE, "ACCORDING TO JOHN SMITH, THE INTERNET HAS TRANSFORMED RESEARCH (2023)." THIS INTEGRATION OF THE AUTHOR'S NAME INTO THE PROSE CAN OFTEN LEAD TO A MORE FLUID READING EXPERIENCE.

CITING WEBSITES WITH NO AUTHOR

A COMMON CHALLENGE WHEN CITING WEBSITES IS THE ABSENCE OF A CLEARLY IDENTIFIED AUTHOR. IN SUCH CASES, THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE DIRECTS USERS TO SUBSTITUTE THE AUTHOR'S NAME WITH THE TITLE OF THE WEBPAGE OR THE NAME OF THE ORGANIZATION RESPONSIBLE FOR THE CONTENT. IF A SPECIFIC WEBPAGE TITLE IS AVAILABLE, IT IS GENERALLY PREFERRED. FOR EXAMPLE, IF A PAGE TITLED "UNDERSTANDING SEO" ON THE WEBSITEMASTERS.COM SITE HAS NO LISTED AUTHOR, THE CITATION MIGHT BE ("UNDERSTANDING SEO" 2023). IF THE ORGANIZATION ITSELF IS CONSIDERED THE AUTHOR AND NO SPECIFIC PAGE TITLE IS USED AS THE PRIMARY IDENTIFIER, YOU WOULD USE THE ORGANIZATION'S NAME, SUCH AS (WEBSITEMASTERS 2023).

IT'S IMPORTANT TO NOTE THAT WHEN USING A TITLE IN PLACE OF AN AUTHOR, YOU SHOULD USE QUOTATION MARKS FOR THE TITLE OF A SHORTER WORK, SUCH AS A WEBPAGE OR AN ARTICLE, AND ITALICS FOR THE TITLE OF A LONGER WORK, SUCH AS A WEBSITE ITSELF OR A BOOK. THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION FOLLOWS, JUST AS IT WOULD WITH A PERSONAL AUTHOR.

CITING WEBSITES WITH NO DATE

ANOTHER FREQUENT ISSUE WITH ONLINE RESOURCES IS THE LACK OF A SPECIFIC PUBLICATION DATE. WHEN NO DATE IS PROVIDED ON A WEBPAGE, THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE SUGGESTS USING "N.D." (FOR "NO DATE") IN PLACE OF THE YEAR. FOR EXAMPLE, A CITATION FOR A WEBPAGE BY JANE DOE WITH NO PUBLICATION DATE WOULD BE (DOE N.D.).

IF BOTH THE AUTHOR AND THE DATE ARE MISSING, YOU WOULD USE THE ORGANIZATIONAL AUTHOR (IF AVAILABLE) OR THE TITLE OF THE WORK FOLLOWED BY "N.D." FOR INSTANCE, IF A WEBPAGE FROM THE "GLOBAL RESEARCH INSTITUTE" LACKS A DATE, THE CITATION COULD BE (GLOBAL RESEARCH INSTITUTE N.D.). IF THE WEBPAGE TITLE IS THE MOST PROMINENT IDENTIFIER AND NO AUTHOR OR DATE IS PRESENT, THE CITATION WOULD RESEMBLE ("RESEARCH TRENDS" N.D.). ALWAYS STRIVE TO FIND THE MOST SPECIFIC AND INFORMATIVE IDENTIFIER.

CITING MULTIPLE AUTHORS

FOR WORKS WITH TWO OR THREE AUTHORS, YOU LIST ALL AUTHORS' LAST NAMES IN THE IN-TEXT CITATION, SEPARATED BY "AND." FOR EXAMPLE, (SMITH AND JONES 2022). IF THERE ARE FOUR OR MORE AUTHORS, YOU CITE ONLY THE FIRST AUTHOR'S LAST NAME FOLLOWED BY "ET AL." AND THE YEAR. FOR INSTANCE, (WILLIAMS ET AL. 2021).

THE BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRY FOR WORKS WITH MULTIPLE AUTHORS WILL FOLLOW SLIGHTLY DIFFERENT RULES, BUT THE PRINCIPLE OF CONCISENESS IN THE IN-TEXT CITATION REMAINS. ENSURING CONSISTENCY BETWEEN YOUR IN-TEXT CITATIONS AND YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRIES IS CRUCIAL FOR THE INTEGRITY OF YOUR WORK.

CITING WORKS WITH CORPORATE AUTHORS

WHEN AN ORGANIZATION, GOVERNMENT AGENCY, OR OTHER CORPORATE BODY IS THE AUTHOR OF A WEBPAGE, ITS NAME IS USED IN PLACE OF AN INDIVIDUAL AUTHOR'S NAME. THIS APPLIES EVEN IF THE ORGANIZATION IS ALSO THE PUBLISHER. FOR EXAMPLE, IF THE "NATIONAL HEALTH ORGANIZATION" PUBLISHED A REPORT ON THEIR WEBSITE IN 2024, THE CITATION WOULD BE (NATIONAL HEALTH ORGANIZATION 2024).

IF THE CORPORATE AUTHOR'S NAME IS LENGTHY, AND IT'S ALSO THE TITLE OF THE WEBSITE, YOU MAY NEED TO ABBREVIATE IT FOR SUBSEQUENT CITATIONS, PROVIDED YOU DEFINE THE ABBREVIATION IN YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY OR CLEARLY ESTABLISH IT IN THE TEXT. HOWEVER, FOR INITIAL CITATIONS, ALWAYS USE THE FULL NAME AS IT APPEARS ON THE SOURCE.

BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRIES FOR WEBSITES IN CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE

THE BIBLIOGRAPHY, OR REFERENCE LIST, IS AN ESSENTIAL COMPONENT OF ANY CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE PAPER. IT PROVIDES READERS WITH COMPLETE INFORMATION ABOUT EVERY SOURCE CITED IN THE TEXT, ALLOWING THEM TO LOCATE AND CONSULT THESE SOURCES THEMSELVES. FOR WEBSITES, COMPILING ACCURATE AND COMPLETE BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRIES IS VITAL, GIVEN THE DYNAMIC NATURE OF ONLINE CONTENT.

ESSENTIAL COMPONENTS OF A WEBSITE CITATION

A STANDARD WEBSITE CITATION IN THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE STYLE TYPICALLY INCLUDES SEVERAL KEY PIECES OF INFORMATION. THESE ARE DESIGNED TO LEAD THE READER TO THE SPECIFIC ONLINE RESOURCE AS DIRECTLY AS POSSIBLE. THE CORE ELEMENTS ARE THE AUTHOR (OR CORPORATE AUTHOR), THE PUBLICATION DATE (OR "N.D."), THE TITLE OF THE SPECIFIC PAGE OR ARTICLE, THE NAME OF THE WEBSITE, AND THE URL. THE INCLUSION OF AN ACCESS DATE IS ALSO OFTEN RECOMMENDED, ESPECIALLY FOR CONTENT THAT MAY BE UPDATED OR REMOVED.

STRUCTURING THE BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRY

THE GENERAL STRUCTURE FOR A WEBSITE BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRY IN CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE IS AS FOLLOWS: AUTHOR'S LAST NAME, FIRST NAME (OR CORPORATE AUTHOR NAME). YEAR. "TITLE OF WEBPAGE." NAME OF WEBSITE. ACCESSED MONTH DAY, YEAR. URL.

FOR EXAMPLE, A WEBPAGE AUTHORED BY JANE DOE, TITLED "THE FUTURE OF AI," PUBLISHED IN 2023 ON THE "TECH INSIGHTS" WEBSITE, WOULD BE LISTED AS: DOE, JANE. 2023. "THE FUTURE OF AI." TECH INSIGHTS. ACCESSED OCTOBER 26, 2023. [HTTPS://WWW.TECHINSIGHTS.COM/FUTURE-OF-AI](https://www.techinsights.com/future-of-ai).

HANDLING URLS AND ACCESS DATES

THE UNIFORM RESOURCE LOCATOR (URL) IS CRUCIAL FOR DIRECTING READERS TO THE EXACT WEBPAGE. IT SHOULD BE PRESENTED EXACTLY AS IT APPEARS, WITHOUT ANY MODIFICATIONS. DO NOT INCLUDE "HTTP://" OR "HTTPS://" IF THE URL IS PRESENTED AS A HYPERLINK IN DIGITAL DOCUMENTS, THOUGH THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE ALLOWS FOR THEIR INCLUSION

FOR CLARITY IN PRINT OR PDF VERSIONS.

THE ACCESS DATE, FORMATTED AS "ACCESSED MONTH DAY, YEAR," IS PARTICULARLY IMPORTANT FOR WEBSITES BECAUSE THEIR CONTENT CAN CHANGE OR DISAPPEAR. INCLUDING THIS DATE INDICATES WHEN THE INFORMATION WAS VIEWED AND DEEMED ACCURATE, PROVIDING A STABLE REFERENCE POINT EVEN IF THE SOURCE IS LATER ALTERED. FOR INSTANCE, IF YOU ACCESSED THE INFORMATION ON OCTOBER 26, 2023, THE ENTRY WOULD INCLUDE "ACCESSED OCTOBER 26, 2023."

SPECIFIC EXAMPLES OF WEBSITE CITATIONS

- **NO AUTHOR, NO DATE:** "UNDERSTANDING CLIMATE CHANGE." ENVIRONMENTAL NEWS NETWORK. N.D. ACCESSED DECEMBER 1, 2023. [HTTPS://WWW.ENVIRONMENTALNEWS.NET/CLIMATE-CHANGE](https://www.environmentalnews.net/climate-change).

COMMON CHALLENGES WITH CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE AND WEBSITES

CITING WEBSITES USING THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE STYLE PRESENTS UNIQUE CHALLENGES THAT REQUIRE CAREFUL ATTENTION. THE DIGITAL ENVIRONMENT IS INHERENTLY MORE FLUID THAN PRINT, MAKING IT DIFFICULT TO PINPOINT EXACT PUBLICATION DATES, AUTHORIAL CREDITS, AND STABLE CONTENT. OVERCOMING THESE HURDLES IS ESSENTIAL FOR MAINTAINING SCHOLARLY INTEGRITY.

FINDING AUTHOR AND DATE INFORMATION

ONE OF THE MOST SIGNIFICANT CHALLENGES IS LOCATING THE AUTHOR AND PUBLICATION DATE. MANY WEBSITES, ESPECIALLY BLOGS OR INFORMATIONAL PAGES, DO NOT PROMINENTLY DISPLAY THIS INFORMATION. IT MIGHT BE BURIED IN AN "ABOUT US" SECTION, IN A FOOTER, OR IT MIGHT BE MISSING ENTIRELY. IN SUCH CASES, DILIGENT SEARCHING IS REQUIRED. IF NO PERSONAL AUTHOR IS FOUND, LOOK FOR A CORPORATE AUTHOR (AN ORGANIZATION OR INSTITUTION). IF NO DATE IS PRESENT, USE "N.D." AND BE SURE TO INCLUDE THE ACCESS DATE.

DEALING WITH DYNAMIC CONTENT

WEBSITES ARE PRONE TO UPDATES, REVISIONS, AND EVEN COMPLETE REMOVAL. THIS DYNAMIC NATURE MEANS THAT THE CONTENT A RESEARCHER CONSULTS TODAY MIGHT BE DIFFERENT OR GONE TOMORROW. THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM ADDRESSES THIS THROUGH THE INCLUSION OF THE ACCESS DATE. HOWEVER, FOR PARTICULARLY IMPORTANT OR VOLATILE SOURCES, IT CAN BE WISE TO SAVE A PDF VERSION OR TAKE SCREENSHOTS TO DOCUMENT THE EXACT CONTENT AT THE TIME OF ACCESS.

CITING DIFFERENT TYPES OF ONLINE RESOURCES

THE BROAD CATEGORY OF "WEBSITES" ENCOMPASSES A WIDE ARRAY OF ONLINE RESOURCES, EACH WITH ITS OWN CITATION CONSIDERATIONS. THIS INCLUDES THINGS LIKE:

- INDIVIDUAL WEBPAGES
- BLOG POSTS
- ARTICLES FROM ONLINE JOURNALS OR MAGAZINES
- VIDEOS OR PODCASTS
- SOCIAL MEDIA POSTS
- ONLINE REPORTS OR WHITE PAPERS

WHILE THE CORE PRINCIPLES OF AUTHOR-DATE CITATION REMAIN, THE SPECIFIC FORMATTING DETAILS FOR EACH OF THESE MIGHT VARY SLIGHTLY, REQUIRING CAREFUL CONSULTATION OF THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE OR OTHER AUTHORITATIVE STYLE GUIDES.

THE ROLE OF THE BIBLIOGRAPHY IN CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE

THE BIBLIOGRAPHY SERVES AS THE COMPREHENSIVE RECORD OF ALL SOURCES CONSULTED AND CITED IN THE BODY OF YOUR WORK. IN THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, IT IS ARRANGED ALPHABETICALLY BY THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME (OR BY THE TITLE IF NO AUTHOR IS LISTED). EACH ENTRY PROVIDES FULL PUBLICATION DETAILS, ALLOWING YOUR READER TO EASILY LOCATE THE ORIGINAL SOURCE. THIS TRANSPARENCY IS FUNDAMENTAL TO ACADEMIC HONESTY AND THE ADVANCEMENT OF KNOWLEDGE. FOR WEBSITES, THE BIBLIOGRAPHY ENSURES THAT EVEN WITH THE EPHEMERAL NATURE OF THE INTERNET, A CLEAR PATH EXISTS BACK TO THE INFORMATION PRESENTED.

BEYOND MERE ATTRIBUTION, A WELL-CONSTRUCTED BIBLIOGRAPHY DEMONSTRATES THE BREADTH AND DEPTH OF YOUR RESEARCH. IT SHOWCASES THE SCHOLARLY FOUNDATION UPON WHICH YOUR ARGUMENTS ARE BUILT AND ALLOWS YOUR READERS TO ENGAGE CRITICALLY WITH THE SOURCES YOU HAVE USED. FOR WEBSITES, THIS MEANS PROVIDING ENOUGH DETAIL SO THAT ANOTHER RESEARCHER COULD FIND THE SAME PAGE, EVEN IF ITS URL OR CONTENT HAS CHANGED SLIGHTLY OVER TIME.

TIPS FOR EFFECTIVE CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE CITATION OF WEBSITES

MASTERING THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE STYLE FOR WEBSITES INVOLVES A COMBINATION OF UNDERSTANDING THE RULES AND DEVELOPING GOOD RESEARCH HABITS. CONSISTENCY IS KEY; ONCE YOU ESTABLISH A METHOD FOR CITING A PARTICULAR TYPE OF ONLINE SOURCE, STICK TO IT THROUGHOUT YOUR DOCUMENT. ALWAYS PRIORITIZE FINDING THE MOST COMPLETE INFORMATION AVAILABLE, INCLUDING AUTHOR, DATE, TITLE, AND SOURCE NAME.

UTILIZE ONLINE TOOLS AND STYLE GUIDE RESOURCES AS NEEDED. WHILE THE PRINCIPLES ARE STRAIGHTFORWARD, SPECIFIC EDGE CASES CAN ARISE. HAVING ACCESS TO THE LATEST EDITION OF THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE OR REPUTABLE ONLINE GUIDES CAN BE INVALUABLE. FURTHERMORE, PROOFREAD YOUR CITATIONS CAREFULLY, BOTH IN-TEXT AND IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHY, TO CATCH ANY ERRORS IN FORMATTING OR COMPLETENESS. A WELL-CITED PAPER REFLECTS POSITIVELY ON THE AUTHOR'S ATTENTION TO DETAIL AND COMMITMENT TO ACADEMIC STANDARDS.

Q: WHAT IS THE PRIMARY DIFFERENCE BETWEEN CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE AND NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY FOR WEBSITES?

A: THE PRIMARY DIFFERENCE LIES IN HOW SOURCES ARE CITED WITHIN THE TEXT. IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, IN-TEXT CITATIONS CONSIST OF THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION ENCLOSED IN PARENTHESES (E.G., SMITH 2023). IN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, FOOTNOTES OR ENDNOTES ARE USED FOR CITATIONS, WITH A CORRESPONDING BIBLIOGRAPHY AT THE END.

Q: HOW DO I CITE A WEBSITE WHERE THE AUTHOR IS AN ORGANIZATION RATHER THAN AN INDIVIDUAL?

A: WHEN AN ORGANIZATION IS THE AUTHOR, USE THE ORGANIZATION'S FULL NAME IN PLACE OF AN INDIVIDUAL AUTHOR'S LAST NAME. FOR EXAMPLE, IF THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION PUBLISHED A REPORT IN 2023, THE IN-TEXT CITATION WOULD BE (WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION 2023), AND THE BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRY WOULD BEGIN WITH "WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION."

Q: WHAT SHOULD I DO IF A WEBSITE HAS NO PUBLICATION DATE?

A: IF A WEBSITE LACKS A PUBLICATION DATE, YOU SHOULD USE "N.D." (WHICH STANDS FOR "NO DATE") IN PLACE OF THE YEAR IN BOTH YOUR IN-TEXT CITATIONS AND YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRIES. FOR EXAMPLE, (DOE N.D.) OR ("ARTICLE TITLE" N.D.).

Q: IS IT ALWAYS NECESSARY TO INCLUDE THE ACCESS DATE FOR WEBSITES CITED IN CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE?

A: WHILE NOT STRICTLY MANDATORY IN ALL CONTEXTS DEPENDING ON THE SPECIFIC EDITION OF CMOS BEING FOLLOWED OR INSTITUTIONAL GUIDELINES, INCLUDING THE ACCESS DATE IS HIGHLY RECOMMENDED FOR WEBSITES. THIS IS BECAUSE WEB CONTENT CAN CHANGE OR DISAPPEAR, AND THE ACCESS DATE PROVIDES A SPECIFIC POINT IN TIME WHEN THE INFORMATION WAS VERIFIED.

Q: HOW DO I CITE A WEBSITE IF IT HAS MULTIPLE AUTHORS?

A: FOR WEBSITES WITH TWO OR THREE AUTHORS, LIST ALL AUTHORS' LAST NAMES IN THE IN-TEXT CITATION SEPARATED BY "AND" (E.G., SMITH AND JONES 2022). IF THERE ARE FOUR OR MORE AUTHORS, CITE ONLY THE FIRST AUTHOR'S LAST NAME FOLLOWED BY "ET AL." AND THE YEAR (E.G., WILLIAMS ET AL. 2021). THE BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRY WILL LIST AUTHORS DIFFERENTLY DEPENDING ON THE NUMBER OF AUTHORS.

Q: WHAT FORMAT SHOULD I USE FOR THE URL IN MY BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRY?

A: YOU SHOULD INCLUDE THE FULL URL AS IT APPEARS. THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE GENERALLY RECOMMENDS INCLUDING THE URL WITHOUT ANY PRECEDING TEXT LIKE "RETRIEVED FROM" OR "AVAILABLE AT," AND WITHOUT HYPERLINKS IN PRINT DOCUMENTS. FOR DIGITAL DOCUMENTS, THEY CAN BE HYPERLINKED.

Q: SHOULD I ITALICIZE THE TITLE OF A WEBSITE IN MY CITATION?

A: IN CHICAGO STYLE, THE TITLE OF THE WEBSITE ITSELF (THE OVERARCHING NAME OF THE SITE) IS OFTEN ITALICIZED IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRY, ESPECIALLY IF IT'S TREATED AS A PUBLICATION TITLE. HOWEVER, THE TITLES OF INDIVIDUAL WEBPAGES OR ARTICLES WITHIN THE WEBSITE ARE TYPICALLY ENCLOSED IN QUOTATION MARKS.

Q: HOW DO I HANDLE CITING SOCIAL MEDIA POSTS IN CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE?

A: CITING SOCIAL MEDIA POSTS CAN BE COMPLEX. GENERALLY, YOU WOULD INCLUDE THE AUTHOR (USERNAME), THE DATE OF THE POST, THE CONTENT OF THE POST (OR A DESCRIPTION IF IT'S VERY LONG, OFTEN IN QUOTATION MARKS), THE PLATFORM NAME, AND THE URL. FOR EXAMPLE: [USERNAME]. [YEAR]. "CONTENT OF THE POST." [PLATFORM NAME]. [MONTH DAY, YEAR]. [URL].

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
