UNDERSTANDING THESE GUIDELINES IS CRUCIAL FOR PRESENTING YOUR RESEARCH WITH ACADEMIC INTEGRITY AND PROFESSIONALISM, MAKING YOUR WORK ACCESSIBLE AND CREDIBLE TO YOUR PEERS AND INSTRUCTORS. MASTERING THE CHICAGO STYLE BIBLIOGRAPHY FOR ECONOMICS WILL ELEVATE THE QUALITY OF YOUR SCHOLARLY OUTPUT.

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UNDERSTANDING CHICAGO STYLE FOR ECONOMICS

THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE PROVIDES A WIDELY RESPECTED FRAMEWORK FOR ACADEMIC CITATION, AND ITS APPLICATION IN ECONOMICS DEMANDS PRECISION. WHILE GENERAL PRINCIPLES REMAIN CONSTANT, THE NATURE OF ECONOMIC RESEARCH OFTEN INVOLVES SPECIFIC TYPES OF SOURCES, SUCH AS WORKING PAPERS, DATASETS, AND ECONOMETRIC SOFTWARE OUTPUTS, WHICH REQUIRE TAILORED CITATION APPROACHES. ADHERING TO CHICAGO STYLE NOT ONLY DEMONSTRATES YOUR DILIGENCE BUT ALSO FACILITATES THE READER'S ABILITY TO LOCATE AND VERIFY THE INFORMATION YOU PRESENT, A CORNERSTONE OF SCIENTIFIC INQUIRY.

THE GOAL IS TO CREATE A SEAMLESS READING EXPERIENCE WHERE THE FOCUS REMAINS ON YOUR ANALYSIS, NOT ON DECIPHERING CITATIONS.

THE TWO SYSTEMS: NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY VS. AUTHOR-DATE

THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE OFFERS TWO PRIMARY CITATION SYSTEMS, AND IT IS IMPORTANT FOR ECONOMISTS TO UNDERSTAND WHICH ONE IS MOST APPROPRIATE FOR THEIR SPECIFIC ACADEMIC CONTEXT OR INSTITUTIONAL REQUIREMENTS. WHILE BOTH SYSTEMS AIM FOR ACCURATE ATTRIBUTION, THEY DIFFER IN THEIR PRESENTATION AND INTEGRATION WITHIN THE TEXT.

THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM

THIS SYSTEM IS CHARACTERIZED BY THE USE OF NUMBERED FOOTNOTES OR ENDNOTES WITHIN THE TEXT, WITH A CORRESPONDING

BIBLIOGRAPHY AT THE END OF THE WORK. FOR ECONOMICS, THIS SYSTEM CAN BE PARTICULARLY USEFUL FOR INCORPORATING DETAILED METHODOLOGICAL EXPLANATIONS OR SUPPLEMENTARY DATA THAT MIGHT OTHERWISE DISRUPT THE FLOW OF THE MAIN TEXT. EACH NOTE PROVIDES A FULL CITATION THE FIRST TIME A SOURCE IS MENTIONED, WITH SUBSEQUENT NOTES FOR THE SAME SOURCE OFTEN SHORTENED.

THE BIBLIOGRAPHY IN THIS SYSTEM IS AN ALPHABETICAL LIST OF ALL SOURCES CITED IN THE NOTES. IT SERVES AS A COMPREHENSIVE REFERENCE LIST FOR READERS TO CONSULT. FOR A CHICAGO STYLE BIBLIOGRAPHY FOR ECONOMICS USING THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, THE ENTRIES WILL GENERALLY BE MORE DESCRIPTIVE THAN IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, OFTEN INCLUDING FULL TITLES AND PUBLICATION DETAILS.

THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM

THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, CONVERSELY, USES PARENTHETICAL IN-TEXT CITATIONS CONSISTING OF THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION (E.G., (KEYNES 1936)). THIS SYSTEM IS OFTEN FAVORED IN THE SOCIAL SCIENCES, INCLUDING ECONOMICS, FOR ITS DIRECTNESS AND EFFICIENCY IN THE TEXT. IT ALLOWS READERS TO QUICKLY IDENTIFY THE SOURCE AND DATE OF INFORMATION WITHOUT EXTENSIVE FOOTNOTES.

THE REFERENCE LIST ACCOMPANYING AN AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM IS TYPICALLY CALLED A "REFERENCE LIST" RATHER THAN A "BIBLIOGRAPHY." IT IS ALSO AN ALPHABETICAL LIST OF ALL SOURCES CITED IN THE TEXT, BUT THE ENTRY FORMAT FOR EACH ITEM IS SLIGHTLY DIFFERENT TO ACCOMMODATE THE IN-TEXT CITATION. FOR A CHICAGO STYLE BIBLIOGRAPHY FOR ECONOMICS EMPLOYING THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, THE FOCUS IS ON PROVIDING SUFFICIENT INFORMATION FOR RETRIEVAL BASED ON THE AUTHOR AND YEAR.

CORE ELEMENTS OF A CHICAGO STYLE CITATION FOR ECONOMICS

REGARDLESS OF THE CHOSEN SYSTEM, CERTAIN CORE ELEMENTS ARE FUNDAMENTAL TO CONSTRUCTING ACCURATE CHICAGO STYLE CITATIONS FOR ECONOMIC RESEARCH. THESE ELEMENTS ENSURE THAT READERS CAN IDENTIFY AND LOCATE THE ORIGINAL SOURCE OF YOUR INFORMATION. CONSISTENCY IN HOW THESE ELEMENTS ARE PRESENTED IS KEY TO A PROFESSIONAL CHICAGO STYLE BIBLIOGRAPHY FOR ECONOMICS.

KEY COMPONENTS GENERALLY INCLUDE:

- AUTHOR(S) OR EDITOR(S)
- PUBLICATION YEAR
- TITLE OF THE WORK
- PUBLISHER INFORMATION (FOR BOOKS)
- JOURNAL TITLE, VOLUME, AND ISSUE NUMBER (FOR ARTICLES)
- PAGE NUMBERS
- DOI OR URL (IF APPLICABLE)

EACH TYPE OF SOURCE WILL ARRANGE THESE ELEMENTS SLIGHTLY DIFFERENTLY TO BEST CONVEY THE NECESSARY INFORMATION FOR RETRIEVAL.

CITING JOURNAL ARTICLES IN ECONOMICS

JOURNAL ARTICLES ARE A STAPLE IN ECONOMIC RESEARCH, AND CORRECTLY CITING THEM IN CHICAGO STYLE IS CRUCIAL. THE FORMAT WILL VARY SLIGHTLY DEPENDING ON WHETHER YOU ARE USING THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY OR AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM.

NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM FOR JOURNAL ARTICLES

IN A FOOTNOTE OR ENDNOTE, A TYPICAL JOURNAL ARTICLE CITATION INCLUDES THE AUTHOR'S FIRST AND LAST NAME, THE TITLE OF THE ARTICLE IN QUOTATION MARKS, THE TITLE OF THE JOURNAL ITALICIZED, THE VOLUME AND ISSUE NUMBER, THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION, AND THE SPECIFIC PAGE NUMBER(S) CITED.

FOR THE BIBLIOGRAPHY, THE FORMAT IS SIMILAR BUT OFTEN OMITTS THE SPECIFIC PAGE NUMBERS UNLESS THE ENTIRE ARTICLE IS BEING CITED. THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME COMES FIRST.

EXAMPLE (BIBLIOGRAPHY ENTRY):

MANKIW, N. GREGORY. "A CONTRIBUTION TO THE THEORY OF ECONOMIC GROWTH." *THE QUARTERLY JOURNAL OF ECONOMICS* 107, no. 2 (MAY 1992): 443-77.

AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM FOR JOURNAL ARTICLES

IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, THE IN-TEXT CITATION WOULD APPEAR AS (MANKIW 1992). THE CORRESPONDING ENTRY IN THE REFERENCE LIST WOULD BE FORMATTED AS FOLLOWS:

EXAMPLE (REFERENCE LIST ENTRY):

NOTE THE PLACEMENT OF THE PUBLICATION YEAR IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE AUTHOR'S NAME.

CITING BOOKS AND BOOK CHAPTERS IN ECONOMICS

BOOKS AND CHAPTERS WITHIN EDITED VOLUMES ARE ALSO FREQUENT SOURCES IN ECONOMICS. THE CHICAGO STYLE BIBLIOGRAPHY FOR ECONOMICS HANDLES THESE SOURCES SYSTEMATICALLY.

NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM FOR BOOKS

A FOOTNOTE OR ENDNOTE WOULD CITE A BOOK WITH THE AUTHOR'S FIRST AND LAST NAME, THE TITLE OF THE BOOK ITALICIZED, THE PLACE OF PUBLICATION, THE PUBLISHER, AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION. PAGE NUMBERS ARE INCLUDED IF A SPECIFIC PASSAGE IS REFERENCED.

EXAMPLE (BIBLIOGRAPHY ENTRY):

KEYNES, JOHN MAYNARD. *THE GENERAL THEORY OF EMPLOYMENT, INTEREST AND MONEY*. NEW YORK: HARCOURT, BRACE AND COMPANY, 1936.

FOR A CHAPTER IN AN EDITED BOOK, THE FORMAT INCLUDES THE CHAPTER AUTHOR, CHAPTER TITLE, "IN," THE BOOK EDITOR(S), BOOK TITLE, PAGE NUMBERS OF THE CHAPTER, AND PUBLICATION DETAILS.

AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM FOR BOOKS

IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, THE IN-TEXT CITATION FOR A BOOK WOULD BE (KEYNES 1936). THE REFERENCE LIST ENTRY FOLLOWS:

EXAMPLE (REFERENCE LIST ENTRY):

KEYNES, JOHN MAYNARD. 1936. *THE GENERAL THEORY OF EMPLOYMENT, INTEREST AND MONEY*. NEW YORK: HARCOURT, BRACE AND COMPANY.

FOR A CHAPTER IN AN EDITED BOOK, THE IN-TEXT CITATION WOULD BE (AUTHOR OF CHAPTER YEAR). THE REFERENCE LIST ENTRY INCLUDES THE CHAPTER AUTHOR, YEAR, CHAPTER TITLE, AND THEN THE BOOK DETAILS.

CITING WORKING PAPERS AND PREPRINTS

THE ECONOMICS PROFESSION HEAVILY RELIES ON WORKING PAPERS AND PREPRINTS, WHICH ARE OFTEN CIRCULATED BEFORE FORMAL PEER REVIEW AND PUBLICATION. CHICAGO STYLE PROVIDES GUIDANCE FOR THESE FREQUENTLY UPDATED AND DYNAMIC SOURCES.

NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM FOR WORKING PAPERS

WHEN CITING A WORKING PAPER, IT'S IMPORTANT TO INCLUDE THE AUTHOR(S), THE TITLE OF THE PAPER, THE SERIES NAME AND NUMBER (IF APPLICABLE), THE INSTITUTION THAT PUBLISHED IT, AND THE YEAR. IF ACCESSED ONLINE, INCLUDE THE URL AND ACCESS DATE.

EXAMPLE (BIBLIOGRAPHY ENTRY):

ACEMOGLU, DARON, AND JAMES A. ROBINSON. "THE RISE OF THE WEST?" NBER WORKING PAPER NO. 15099. CAMBRIDGE, MA: NATIONAL BUREAU OF ECONOMIC RESEARCH, 2009.

AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM FOR WORKING PAPERS

THE IN-TEXT CITATION WOULD BE (ACEMOGLU AND ROBINSON 2009). THE REFERENCE LIST ENTRY WOULD BE:

EXAMPLE (REFERENCE LIST ENTRY):

ACEMOGLU, DARON, AND JAMES A. ROBINSON. 2009. "THE RISE OF THE WEST?" NBER WORKING PAPER NO. 15099. CAMBRIDGE, MA: NATIONAL BUREAU OF ECONOMIC RESEARCH.

FOR PREPRINTS AVAILABLE ON PLATFORMS LIKE ARXIV, INCLUDE THE AUTHOR(S), TITLE, PLATFORM NAME, AND THE UNIQUE IDENTIFIER OR URL.

CITING ONLINE RESOURCES AND DATA IN ECONOMICS

THE DIGITAL AGE MEANS ECONOMISTS FREQUENTLY CITE ONLINE DATABASES, DATASETS, AND WEB PAGES. A ROBUST CHICAGO STYLE BIBLIOGRAPHY FOR ECONOMICS MUST ACCOUNT FOR THESE DIVERSE DIGITAL MATERIALS.

NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM FOR ONLINE RESOURCES

FOR ONLINE DATA OR REPORTS, INCLUDE THE AUTHOR OR ORGANIZATION, THE TITLE OF THE PAGE OR RESOURCE, THE NAME OF THE WEBSITE, AND THE URL. CRUCIALLY, INCLUDE THE DATE OF ACCESS.

EXAMPLE (BIBLIOGRAPHY ENTRY):

WORLD BANK. "GDP (CURRENT US\$)." THE WORLD BANK DATA. ACCESSED OCTOBER 26, 2023.
[HTTPS://DATA.WORLDBANK.ORG/INDICATOR/NY.GDP.MKTP.CD](https://data.worldbank.org/indicator/NY.GDP.MKTP.CD).

AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM FOR ONLINE RESOURCES

THE IN-TEXT CITATION MIGHT BE (WORLD BANK). THE REFERENCE LIST ENTRY WOULD INCLUDE:

EXAMPLE (REFERENCE LIST ENTRY):

WORLD BANK. N.D. "GDP (CURRENT US\$)." THE WORLD BANK DATA. ACCESSED OCTOBER 26, 2023.
[HTTPS://DATA.WORLDBANK.ORG/INDICATOR/NY.GDP.MKTP.CD](https://data.worldbank.org/indicator/NY.GDP.MKTP.CD).

NOTE THAT FOR ONLINE RESOURCES WHERE A PUBLICATION DATE IS NOT EVIDENT, "N.D." (NO DATE) IS USED, FOLLOWED BY THE ACCESS DATE.

BUILDING YOUR CHICAGO STYLE BIBLIOGRAPHY FOR ECONOMICS

CREATING A COMPREHENSIVE AND ACCURATE CHICAGO STYLE BIBLIOGRAPHY FOR ECONOMICS INVOLVES METICULOUS ATTENTION TO DETAIL. BEGIN BY METICULOUSLY GATHERING ALL NECESSARY BIBLIOGRAPHIC INFORMATION FOR EACH SOURCE USED IN YOUR RESEARCH. THIS INCLUDES AUTHOR(S), PUBLICATION TITLES, DATES, PUBLISHER INFORMATION, JOURNAL DETAILS, PAGE NUMBERS, AND ANY RELEVANT URLS OR DOIS. IT IS HIGHLY ADVISABLE TO MAINTAIN A RUNNING LIST OF YOUR SOURCES AS YOU CONDUCT YOUR RESEARCH, RATHER THAN TRYING TO COMPILE IT RETROSPECTIVELY.

ORGANIZE YOUR COLLECTED INFORMATION ACCORDING TO THE SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS OF THE CHOSEN CHICAGO STYLE SYSTEM (NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY OR AUTHOR-DATE). FOR THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, EACH ENTRY IN THE FINAL BIBLIOGRAPHY SHOULD BE FORMATTED CONSISTENTLY, TYPICALLY WITH THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME FIRST, FOLLOWED BY THEIR FIRST NAME. FOR THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWS THE AUTHOR'S NAME.

FORMATTING AND CONSISTENCY IN YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY

CONSISTENCY IS PARAMOUNT IN ANY ACADEMIC BIBLIOGRAPHY, AND THE CHICAGO STYLE BIBLIOGRAPHY FOR ECONOMICS IS NO EXCEPTION. ENSURE THAT ALL ENTRIES FOLLOW THE ESTABLISHED FORMATTING RULES PRECISELY. THIS INCLUDES THE CORRECT USE OF PUNCTUATION, CAPITALIZATION, AND ITALICS. FOR INSTANCE, BOOK TITLES AND JOURNAL TITLES SHOULD ALWAYS BE ITALICIZED, WHILE ARTICLE TITLES ARE TYPICALLY ENCLOSED IN QUOTATION MARKS.

PAY CLOSE ATTENTION TO THE SPACING AND INDENTATION OF YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY. WHILE CHICAGO STYLE ALLOWS FOR SOME FLEXIBILITY IN INDENTATION (HANGING INDENTS ARE COMMON AND RECOMMENDED FOR READABILITY), UNIFORMITY IS CRUCIAL. DOUBLE-CHECK THAT EVERY ELEMENT OF EACH CITATION IS PRESENT AND CORRECTLY RENDERED. A WELL-FORMATTED BIBLIOGRAPHY NOT ONLY DEMONSTRATES YOUR ACADEMIC RIGOR BUT ALSO ENHANCES THE PROFESSIONAL PRESENTATION OF YOUR ECONOMIC RESEARCH.

REVIEWING YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY AGAINST A RELIABLE STYLE GUIDE OR SOFTWARE THAT CHECKS CHICAGO STYLE COMPLIANCE CAN BE IMMENSELY HELPFUL. OFTEN, SMALL ERRORS IN PUNCTUATION OR CAPITALIZATION CAN DETRACT FROM THE OVERALL QUALITY OF YOUR WORK. THE GOAL IS TO MAKE YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY A CLEAR, UNAMBIGUOUS, AND EASILY NAVIGABLE RESOURCE FOR YOUR READERS, REINFORCING THE CREDIBILITY AND THOROUGHNESS OF YOUR ECONOMIC ANALYSIS.

FAQ: CHICAGO STYLE BIBLIOGRAPHY FOR ECONOMICS

Q: WHAT IS THE PRIMARY DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY AND AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEMS IN CHICAGO STYLE FOR ECONOMICS PAPERS?

A: THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM USES FOOTNOTES OR ENDNOTES WITHIN THE TEXT FOR CITATIONS AND A FULL BIBLIOGRAPHY AT THE END. THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM USES PARENTHETICAL IN-TEXT CITATIONS (AUTHOR YEAR) AND A REFERENCE LIST AT THE END. ECONOMISTS MAY CHOOSE BASED ON DISCIPLINARY CONVENTIONS OR INSTRUCTOR PREFERENCE.

Q: HOW DO I CITE A WORKING PAPER IN CHICAGO STYLE FOR ECONOMICS?

A: FOR A CHICAGO STYLE BIBLIOGRAPHY FOR ECONOMICS, CITE A WORKING PAPER BY INCLUDING THE AUTHOR(S), TITLE OF THE PAPER (IN QUOTATION MARKS), SERIES NAME AND NUMBER, THE PUBLISHING INSTITUTION, AND THE YEAR. IF ACCESSED ONLINE, INCLUDE THE URL AND ACCESS DATE.

Q: IS THERE A SPECIFIC WAY TO FORMAT CITATIONS FOR ECONOMIC DATASETS IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: YES, WHEN CITING ECONOMIC DATASETS IN CHICAGO STYLE, INCLUDE THE CREATOR OR SOURCE OF THE DATA, THE TITLE OF THE DATASET, VERSION OR RELEASE NUMBER (IF APPLICABLE), THE PUBLISHER OR DISTRIBUTOR, AND THE YEAR. IF ACCESSED ONLINE, PROVIDE THE URL AND ACCESS DATE.

Q: SHOULD I USE DOIs OR URLs FOR ONLINE JOURNAL ARTICLES IN MY CHICAGO STYLE BIBLIOGRAPHY FOR ECONOMICS?

A: CHICAGO STYLE PREFERS DOIs (DIGITAL OBJECT IDENTIFIERS) WHEN AVAILABLE FOR ONLINE JOURNAL ARTICLES AS THEY ARE MORE STABLE THAN URLs. IF A DOI IS NOT AVAILABLE, THEN A URL SHOULD BE PROVIDED, ALONG WITH THE ACCESS DATE.

Q: HOW DO I HANDLE MULTIPLE AUTHORS IN A CHICAGO STYLE BIBLIOGRAPHY FOR ECONOMICS?

A: FOR THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, LIST ALL AUTHORS IN THE FOOTNOTE/ENDNOTE. IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHY, LIST THE FIRST AUTHOR FOLLOWED BY "ET AL." IF THERE ARE MORE THAN A SPECIFIED NUMBER OF AUTHORS (TYPICALLY THREE OR MORE, BUT CHECK THE LATEST CMOS EDITION). FOR THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, LIST ALL AUTHORS IN THE REFERENCE LIST. IN-TEXT CITATIONS FOR MULTIPLE AUTHORS ALSO FOLLOW SPECIFIC RULES DEPENDING ON THE NUMBER OF AUTHORS.

Q: WHAT IS THE CORRECT WAY TO ABBREVIATE JOURNAL TITLES IN A CHICAGO STYLE

BIBLIOGRAPHY FOR ECONOMICS?

A: WHILE CHICAGO STYLE GENERALLY PREFERS FULL JOURNAL TITLES, SOME ECONOMICS JOURNALS OR DEPARTMENTS MAY ALLOW OR EXPECT ABBREVIATIONS FOR WELL-KNOWN JOURNALS.
