**CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATION FOR CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR DATE PARENTHETICAL** IS A CRITICAL SKILL FOR ACADEMIC AND PROFESSIONAL WRITERS AIMING FOR CLARITY AND CREDIBILITY. UNDERSTANDING HOW TO PROPERLY ATTRIBUTE SOURCES WITHIN YOUR TEXT USING THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM IS FUNDAMENTAL TO AVOIDING PLAGIARISM AND GUIDING YOUR READERS SEAMLESSLY TO YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY. THIS COMPREHENSIVE GUIDE WILL DEMYSTIFY THE PROCESS, COVERING EVERYTHING FROM THE BASIC MECHANICS OF PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS TO HANDLING COMPLEX SOURCE TYPES AND COMMON CHALLENGES ENCOUNTERED IN THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE'S AUTHOR-DATE APPROACH. WE WILL EXPLORE THE CORE COMPONENTS, THE DISTINCTION BETWEEN IN-TEXT CITATIONS AND THE REFERENCE LIST, AND HOW TO ENSURE ACCURACY AND CONSISTENCY THROUGHOUT YOUR WORK.

## UNDERSTANDING THE CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM

THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE OFFERS TWO PRIMARY CITATION SYSTEMS: NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY AND AUTHOR-DATE. THIS ARTICLE FOCUSES EXCLUSIVELY ON THE LATTER, THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, WHICH IS FAVORED IN MANY SOCIAL SCIENCES AND NATURAL SCIENCES DISCIPLINES. UNLIKE THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, WHICH USES FOOTNOTES OR ENDNOTES TO CITE SOURCES, THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM INTEGRATES BRIEF CITATIONS DIRECTLY INTO THE TEXT, TYPICALLY AT THE END OF A SENTENCE OR CLAUSE, FOLLOWED BY A CORRESPONDING ENTRY IN A REFERENCE LIST AT THE END OF THE DOCUMENT. THIS METHOD IS OFTEN PREFERRED FOR ITS DIRECTNESS AND EASE OF USE FOR READERS WHO MAY WISH TO QUICKLY IDENTIFY THE SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

THE FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLE BEHIND THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM IS TO PROVIDE JUST ENOUGH INFORMATION WITHIN THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION TO ALLOW THE READER TO LOCATE THE FULL BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRY WITHOUT INTERRUPTING THE FLOW OF YOUR WRITING TOO SEVERELY. THIS BALANCE IS KEY TO EFFECTIVE ACADEMIC COMMUNICATION. THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION ARE THE MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS, BUT ADDITIONAL INFORMATION, SUCH AS PAGE NUMBERS, IS OFTEN NECESSARY FOR DIRECT QUOTATIONS OR PARAPHRASES OF SPECIFIC IDEAS.

## CORE COMPONENTS OF CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS

THE CONSTRUCTION OF A CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATION IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM IS RELATIVELY STRAIGHTFORWARD, BUT ATTENTION TO DETAIL IS PARAMOUNT. EACH CITATION SHOULD INCLUDE THE ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS THAT UNIQUELY IDENTIFY THE SOURCE BEING REFERENCED.

### THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME

THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME IS THE CORNERSTONE OF ANY PARENTHETICAL CITATION WITHIN THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM. THIS IS TYPICALLY THE SURNAME OF THE INDIVIDUAL CREDITED WITH CREATING THE WORK. IF A WORK HAS MULTIPLE AUTHORS, SPECIFIC RULES APPLY REGARDING HOW TO LIST THEM IN THE CITATION, DEPENDING ON THE NUMBER OF AUTHORS. FOR INSTANCE, WITH TWO AUTHORS, BOTH LAST NAMES ARE USUALLY INCLUDED, SEPARATED BY "AND." FOR THREE OR MORE

AUTHORS, THE CONVENTION IS TO LIST ONLY THE FIRST AUTHOR'S LAST NAME FOLLOWED BY "ET AL." THIS SHORTHAND SAVES SPACE AND MAINTAINS READABILITY, ESPECIALLY WHEN CITING FREQUENTLY FROM A WORK WITH A LARGE NUMBER OF CONTRIBUTORS.

## THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION

FOLLOWING THE AUTHOR'S NAME, THE YEAR THE SOURCE WAS PUBLISHED IS CRUCIAL. THIS ELEMENT HELPS READERS UNDERSTAND THE CURRENCY OF THE INFORMATION AND DISTINGUISH BETWEEN DIFFERENT EDITIONS OR WORKS BY THE SAME AUTHOR PUBLISHED IN DIFFERENT YEARS. IF A SOURCE DOES NOT HAVE A PUBLICATION DATE, WRITERS OFTEN USE "N.D." TO INDICATE "NO DATE." HOWEVER, IT'S ALWAYS BEST TO CONSULT STYLE GUIDES OR INSTRUCTORS FOR PREFERRED METHODS WHEN DEALING WITH UNDATED MATERIALS, AS ARCHIVAL SOURCES OR UNPUBLISHED MANUSCRIPTS MIGHT HAVE SPECIFIC GUIDELINES.

## PAGE NUMBERS (WHEN NECESSARY)

WHILE THE AUTHOR AND YEAR ARE THE MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS, PAGE NUMBERS ARE ESSENTIAL WHEN YOU ARE QUOTING DIRECTLY FROM A SOURCE OR PARAPHRASING A VERY SPECIFIC IDEA THAT NEEDS PRECISE LOCATION. INCLUDING THE PAGE NUMBER ALLOWS YOUR READER TO FIND THE EXACT PASSAGE YOU ARE REFERRING TO. THE FORMAT FOR PAGE NUMBERS TYPICALLY INVOLVES THE ABBREVIATION "P." FOR A SINGLE PAGE OR "PP." FOR A RANGE OF PAGES, FOLLOWED BY THE NUMERAL(S). FOR EXAMPLE, "(SMITH 2020, P. 45)" OR "(JONES AND LEE 2018, PP. 112-115)."

## HANDLING MULTIPLE AUTHORS

WHEN A WORK HAS MULTIPLE AUTHORS, THE WAY YOU REPRESENT THEM IN YOUR PARENTHETICAL CITATION DEPENDS ON THE NUMBER OF AUTHORS INVOLVED. THIS IS A KEY ASPECT OF ADHERING TO THE CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE CONVENTIONS. UNDERSTANDING THESE NUANCES ENSURES YOUR CITATIONS ARE BOTH ACCURATE AND COMPLIANT WITH THE ESTABLISHED STANDARDS.

- **TWO AUTHORS:** LIST BOTH AUTHORS' LAST NAMES, SEPARATED BY "AND." FOR EXAMPLE: (MILLER AND GARCIA 2021).
- **THREE TO FIVE AUTHORS:** LIST THE FIRST AUTHOR'S LAST NAME FOLLOWED BY "ET AL." FOR EXAMPLE: (CHEN ET AL. 2019).
- **SIX OR MORE AUTHORS:** EVEN WITH A LARGE NUMBER OF AUTHORS, THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM GENERALLY REQUIRES LISTING ONLY THE FIRST AUTHOR'S LAST NAME FOLLOWED BY "ET AL." THIS PREVENTS CITATIONS FROM BECOMING EXCESSIVELY LONG AND CUMBERSOME. FOR EXAMPLE: (DAVIS ET AL. 2022).

## WORKS WITH NO AUTHOR

IN CASES WHERE A WORK LACKS AN IDENTIFIABLE AUTHOR, SUCH AS CORPORATE PUBLICATIONS, GOVERNMENT REPORTS, OR ANONYMOUS ARTICLES, YOU SHOULD USE THE TITLE OF THE WORK IN PLACE OF THE AUTHOR'S NAME. IF THE TITLE IS LONG, YOU CAN USE A SHORTENED VERSION. THE FULL TITLE WILL, OF COURSE, APPEAR IN THE REFERENCE LIST. FOR EXAMPLE, IF A REPORT IS TITLED "THE ECONOMIC IMPACT OF RENEWABLE ENERGY IN URBAN ENVIRONMENTS," YOUR IN-TEXT CITATION MIGHT LOOK LIKE: ("ECONOMIC IMPACT" 2023). THIS ENSURES THAT THE READER CAN STILL FIND THE SOURCE EASILY IN THE REFERENCE LIST.

# CITING DIFFERENT SOURCE TYPES IN CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE

THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM IS ADAPTABLE TO A WIDE ARRAY OF SOURCE MATERIALS, FROM BOOKS AND JOURNAL ARTICLES TO WEBSITES AND INTERVIEWS. THE CORE PRINCIPLES REMAIN CONSISTENT, BUT THE SPECIFIC DETAILS OF HOW TO REPRESENT EACH SOURCE TYPE IN YOUR PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS AND REFERENCE LIST ENTRIES CAN VARY. FAMILIARIZING YOURSELF WITH THESE DISTINCTIONS IS CRUCIAL FOR ACCURATE CITATION.

## Books

CITING BOOKS IN THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM IS TYPICALLY STRAIGHTFORWARD. THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION WILL INCLUDE THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION. FOR DIRECT QUOTES OR SPECIFIC PARAPHRASES, THE PAGE NUMBER(S) ARE ALSO INCLUDED. FOR EXAMPLE: (JOHNSON 2017, p. 88). WHEN CITING A BOOK WITH MULTIPLE AUTHORS, FOLLOW THE RULES PREVIOUSLY OUTLINED FOR HANDLING MULTIPLE AUTHORS.

## JOURNAL ARTICLES

JOURNAL ARTICLES ARE COMMON SOURCES IN ACADEMIC WRITING. THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION WILL USE THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE PUBLICATION YEAR. PAGE NUMBERS ARE ESSENTIAL FOR DIRECT QUOTES OR SPECIFIC IDEAS. A TYPICAL CITATION FOR A JOURNAL ARTICLE WOULD APPEAR AS: (WILLIAMS AND BROWN 2018, pp. 30-31). ENSURE THAT THE AUTHOR NAMES AND PUBLICATION YEAR PRECISELY MATCH THOSE IN YOUR REFERENCE LIST ENTRY FOR THE ARTICLE, WHICH WILL INCLUDE THE JOURNAL TITLE, VOLUME, ISSUE NUMBER, AND PAGE RANGE.

## WEBSITES AND ONLINE RESOURCES

CITING ONLINE SOURCES REQUIRES CAREFUL ATTENTION TO THE INFORMATION AVAILABLE. OFTEN, WEBSITES MAY NOT HAVE A CLEAR AUTHOR OR PUBLICATION DATE. IN SUCH CASES, USE THE ORGANIZATION OR WEBSITE NAME AS THE AUTHOR, OR IF NO AUTHOR IS IDENTIFIABLE, USE THE TITLE OF THE PAGE OR ARTICLE. FOR THE DATE, USE THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION OR, IF UNAVAILABLE, "N.D." FOR EXAMPLE, IF YOU ARE CITING INFORMATION FROM A WEBPAGE BY A SPECIFIC ORGANIZATION, IT MIGHT LOOK LIKE: (NATIONAL PARK SERVICE 2022). IF A SPECIFIC PAGE ON A WEBSITE IS RELEVANT, AND IT HAS A CLEAR AUTHOR AND DATE, CITE IT AS YOU WOULD ANY OTHER SOURCE: (LEE 2023, SEC. 3). ALWAYS STRIVE TO PROVIDE THE MOST SPECIFIC INFORMATION POSSIBLE.

## OTHER SOURCE TYPES

THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM CAN ALSO ACCOMMODATE VARIOUS OTHER SOURCES, INCLUDING:

- **NEWSPAPER AND MAGAZINE ARTICLES:** CITE BY AUTHOR (IF AVAILABLE) AND YEAR. PAGE NUMBERS ARE OFTEN INCLUDED, ESPECIALLY FOR PRINT VERSIONS. FOR ONLINE ARTICLES, A SECTION OR PARAGRAPH NUMBER MIGHT BE USED IF PAGE NUMBERS ARE ABSENT.
- **INTERVIEWS:** IF YOU CONDUCTED THE INTERVIEW, YOU MIGHT CITE IT AS "(INTERVIEW WITH DR. ANYA SHARMA, OCTOBER 15, 2023)" OR BY THE INTERVIEWEE'S NAME AND DATE IF IT'S A PUBLISHED INTERVIEW.
- **DISSERTATIONS AND THESES:** CITE BY THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND YEAR. FOR UNPUBLISHED WORKS, THE FULL CITATION IN THE REFERENCE LIST WILL PROVIDE MORE CONTEXT ABOUT ITS AVAILABILITY.

THE KEY IS TO EXTRACT THE AUTHOR, YEAR, AND, IF APPLICABLE, PAGE OR SECTION INFORMATION THAT MOST ACCURATELY IDENTIFIES THE SOURCE FOR THE READER.

# COMMON SCENARIOS AND BEST PRACTICES

NAVIGATING THE INTRICACIES OF CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS INVOLVES UNDERSTANDING HOW TO HANDLE FREQUENTLY ENCOUNTERED SITUATIONS AND ADOPTING BEST PRACTICES TO ENSURE CLARITY AND ACCURACY. THESE GUIDELINES HELP WRITERS MAINTAIN CONSISTENCY AND AVOID COMMON PITFALLS.

## DIRECT QUOTATIONS

WHEN YOU USE A DIRECT QUOTATION, IT IS IMPERATIVE TO INCLUDE THE PAGE NUMBER WHERE THE QUOTE APPEARS. THIS ALLOWS YOUR READER TO VERIFY THE EXACT WORDING AND CONTEXT. THE FORMAT IS TYPICALLY (AUTHOR YEAR, P. ) FOR A SINGLE PAGE OR (AUTHOR YEAR, PP. -) FOR A PAGE RANGE. FOR EXAMPLE: "THE IMPLICATIONS OF THIS DISCOVERY WERE PROFOUND" (ROBERTS 2015, P. 102).

## PARAPHRASING AND SUMMARIZING

EVEN WHEN PARAPHRASING OR SUMMARIZING AN AUTHOR'S IDEAS, IT IS GOOD PRACTICE TO INCLUDE THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION. THIS GIVES CREDIT TO THE ORIGINAL AUTHOR AND DIRECTS READERS TO THE SOURCE FOR FURTHER EXPLORATION. WHILE PAGE NUMBERS ARE NOT ALWAYS STRICTLY REQUIRED FOR PARAPHRASES, THEY ARE HIGHLY RECOMMENDED, ESPECIALLY WHEN SUMMARIZING A SPECIFIC ARGUMENT OR PIECE OF EVIDENCE. FOR INSTANCE: RESEARCH SUGGESTS THAT A BALANCED DIET IS CRUCIAL FOR COGNITIVE FUNCTION (CHEN 2019).

## WHEN THE AUTHOR AND YEAR ARE IN THE SENTENCE

SOMETIMES, YOU CAN INTEGRATE THE AUTHOR AND YEAR DIRECTLY INTO YOUR SENTENCE. IN SUCH CASES, YOU DO NOT NEED A PARENTHETICAL CITATION FOR THOSE SPECIFIC ELEMENTS. FOR EXAMPLE: AS NOTED BY SMITH (2020), THE RESEARCH FINDINGS WERE UNEXPECTED. IF YOU ARE QUOTING DIRECTLY FROM THIS SOURCE WITHIN THE SENTENCE, YOU WOULD STILL ADD THE PAGE NUMBER: SMITH (2020) ARGUED THAT "THE DATA STRONGLY SUPPORTED THE HYPOTHESIS" (P. 55).

## SUBSEQUENT CITATIONS OF THE SAME SOURCE

ONCE YOU HAVE CITED A SOURCE IN YOUR TEXT, SUBSEQUENT CITATIONS OF THE SAME SOURCE DO NOT NEED TO REPEAT ALL THE INFORMATION IF IT'S CLEAR WHICH SOURCE YOU ARE REFERRING TO. HOWEVER, WITHIN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, IT'S GENERALLY RECOMMENDED TO RETAIN THE AUTHOR AND YEAR FOR CLARITY, ESPECIALLY IF YOU ARE CITING MULTIPLE WORKS BY THE SAME AUTHOR. IF YOU ARE QUOTING DIRECTLY, THE PAGE NUMBER MUST ALWAYS BE INCLUDED.

## ENSURING ACCURACY AND CONSISTENCY

ACCURACY AND CONSISTENCY ARE THE HALLMARKS OF A WELL-CITED ACADEMIC OR PROFESSIONAL DOCUMENT. THE CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE PARENTHETICAL SYSTEM, WHEN APPLIED DILIGENTLY, SIGNIFICANTLY CONTRIBUTES TO THE OVERALL CREDIBILITY AND PROFESSIONALISM OF YOUR WORK.

## CROSS-REFERENCING WITH THE REFERENCE LIST

THE MOST CRITICAL STEP IN ENSURING ACCURACY IS TO METICULOUSLY CROSS-REFERENCE EVERY IN-TEXT PARENTHETICAL CITATION WITH ITS CORRESPONDING ENTRY IN THE REFERENCE LIST. EACH PIECE OF INFORMATION IN THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION—AUTHOR'S NAME, YEAR, AND PAGE NUMBER (IF APPLICABLE)—MUST PRECISELY MATCH THE DETAILS IN THE REFERENCE LIST ENTRY. THIS VERIFICATION PROCESS IS ESSENTIAL FOR AVOIDING ERRORS AND MAKING YOUR CITATIONS FUNCTIONAL FOR

THE READER.

## USING CITATION MANAGEMENT TOOLS

FOR LONGER WORKS OR PROJECTS WITH EXTENSIVE SOURCE MATERIAL, CITATION MANAGEMENT TOOLS CAN BE INVALUABLE. SOFTWARE LIKE ZOTERO, MENDELEY, OR ENDNOTE CAN HELP YOU ORGANIZE YOUR SOURCES, GENERATE BIBLIOGRAPHIES, AND INSERT IN-TEXT CITATIONS ACCORDING TO THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE STYLE. WHILE THESE TOOLS CAN AUTOMATE MUCH OF THE PROCESS, IT IS STILL VITAL TO REVIEW THEIR OUTPUT FOR ACCURACY, AS THEY ARE NOT INFALLIBLE.

## CONSULTING THE OFFICIAL STYLE GUIDE

THE ULTIMATE AUTHORITY ON CHICAGO STYLE IS THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE ITSELF. FOR COMPLEX CITATION SCENARIOS, SPECIFIC SOURCE TYPES NOT COVERED HERE, OR TO CLARIFY ANY AMBIGUITIES, ALWAYS REFER TO THE LATEST EDITION OF THE MANUAL. MANY INSTITUTIONS AND PUBLISHERS ALSO PROVIDE THEIR OWN STYLE GUIDES THAT MAY HAVE SLIGHT VARIATIONS OR SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS BASED ON THE CHICAGO MODEL.

BY UNDERSTANDING THE FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLES, MASTERING THE DIFFERENT CITATION COMPONENTS, AND DILIGENTLY APPLYING BEST PRACTICES, WRITERS CAN CONFIDENTLY NAVIGATE THE CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATION FOR CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE PARENTHETICAL REQUIREMENTS. THIS ENSURES THAT THEIR WORK IS PROPERLY ATTRIBUTED, ETHICALLY SOUND, AND EASILY NAVIGABLE FOR THEIR AUDIENCE.

## FAQ

### Q: WHAT IS THE PRIMARY DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE CHICAGO NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM AND THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM FOR PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS?

A: THE PRIMARY DIFFERENCE LIES IN HOW SOURCES ARE REFERENCED WITHIN THE TEXT. THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM USES FOOTNOTES OR ENDNOTES, WHILE THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM USES BRIEF PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS IN THE TEXT (AUTHOR YEAR, P. ) THAT CORRESPOND TO A FULL REFERENCE LIST AT THE END OF THE DOCUMENT.

### Q: WHEN IS IT MANDATORY TO INCLUDE A PAGE NUMBER IN A CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE PARENTHETICAL CITATION?

A: IT IS MANDATORY TO INCLUDE A PAGE NUMBER WHEN YOU ARE DIRECTLY QUOTING FROM A SOURCE. IT IS ALSO HIGHLY RECOMMENDED WHEN PARAPHRASING OR SUMMARIZING A SPECIFIC ARGUMENT, PIECE OF EVIDENCE, OR IDEA THAT REQUIRES PRECISE LOCATION WITHIN THE SOURCE.

### Q: HOW DO I CITE A SOURCE WITH AN UNKNOWN PUBLICATION DATE IN THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM?

A: IF A SOURCE HAS NO IDENTIFIABLE PUBLICATION DATE, YOU SHOULD USE "N.D." IN PLACE OF THE YEAR IN YOUR PARENTHETICAL CITATION AND IN THE CORRESPONDING REFERENCE LIST ENTRY. FOR EXAMPLE: (GARCIA 2023, N.D., P. 75).

### Q: WHAT IS THE CORRECT FORMAT FOR CITING A WEBSITE WITH NO AUTHOR IN CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE?

A: IF A WEBSITE HAS NO AUTHOR, YOU SHOULD USE THE TITLE OF THE WEBPAGE OR THE NAME OF THE ORGANIZATION RESPONSIBLE FOR THE SITE AS THE AUTHOR IN YOUR PARENTHETICAL CITATION. FOR EXAMPLE: (WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION

2024) or ("CLIMATE CHANGE IMPACTS" 2023).

## Q: HOW DO I CITE A WORK THAT HAS BEEN TRANSLATED INTO ENGLISH?

A: WHEN CITING A TRANSLATED WORK IN THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, YOU TYPICALLY CITE THE TRANSLATOR'S NAME (IF RELEVANT TO YOUR ARGUMENT OR IF YOU ARE REFERENCING THEIR TRANSLATION SPECIFICALLY) AND THE YEAR OF THE TRANSLATION, ALONG WITH THE ORIGINAL AUTHOR AND YEAR IF KNOWN AND PERTINENT. THE REFERENCE LIST ENTRY WILL PROVIDE FULL DETAILS ON BOTH THE ORIGINAL AND TRANSLATED VERSIONS. FOR PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS, FOCUS ON THE AUTHOR AND YEAR THAT IS MOST RELEVANT TO YOUR CITATION, USUALLY THE ORIGINAL AUTHOR AND PUBLICATION YEAR, FOLLOWED BY PAGE NUMBERS.

## Q: CAN I USE "ET AL." FOR CITATIONS WITH TWO AUTHORS?

A: NO, THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM GENERALLY REQUIRES YOU TO LIST BOTH AUTHORS' LAST NAMES FOR WORKS WITH TWO AUTHORS, SEPARATED BY "AND." THE "ET AL." ABBREVIATION IS TYPICALLY RESERVED FOR WORKS WITH THREE OR MORE AUTHORS.

## Q: WHAT IF I AM CITING MULTIPLE WORKS BY THE SAME AUTHOR PUBLISHED IN THE SAME YEAR?

A: WHEN CITING MULTIPLE WORKS BY THE SAME AUTHOR PUBLISHED IN THE SAME YEAR, YOU SHOULD ASSIGN LETTERS (A, B, C, ETC.) TO THE PUBLICATION YEARS IN BOTH THE PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS AND THE REFERENCE LIST ENTRIES. FOR EXAMPLE, IF AN AUTHOR PUBLISHED TWO BOOKS IN 2021, YOU MIGHT CITE THEM AS (DAVIS 2021A, P. 30) AND (DAVIS 2021B, P. 115).

## Q: HOW DO I CITE A CHAPTER WITHIN AN EDITED BOOK IN CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE?

A: FOR AN EDITED BOOK, YOU CITE THE AUTHOR OF THE CHAPTER AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION OF THE BOOK. THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION WOULD BE (CHAPTER AUTHOR YEAR, P. ). THE REFERENCE LIST ENTRY WILL THEN PROVIDE FULL DETAILS, INCLUDING THE EDITOR'S NAME, BOOK TITLE, AND PAGE RANGE OF THE CHAPTER.

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
