WE WILL DELVE INTO THE FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLES, EXPLORE COMMON SCENARIOS INVOLVING WEBSITES, ARTICLES, AND OTHER DIGITAL FORMATS, AND PROVIDE ACTIONABLE ADVICE TO HELP YOU CRAFT ACCURATE AND EFFECTIVE IN-TEXT CITATIONS. UNDERSTANDING THESE RULES IS CRUCIAL FOR ANY STUDENT OR RESEARCHER AIMING TO AVOID PLAGIARISM AND PRESENT THEIR WORK PROFESSIONALLY.

UNDERSTANDING THE CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM

THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE (CMOS) OFFERS TWO PRIMARY CITATION SYSTEMS: NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY AND AUTHOR-DATE. THIS ARTICLE FOCUSES EXCLUSIVELY ON THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, WHICH IS PREVALENT IN THE SCIENCES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES. IN THIS SYSTEM, IN-TEXT CITATIONS (PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS) ARE EMBEDDED DIRECTLY WITHIN THE BODY OF YOUR TEXT, POINTING READERS TO A CORRESPONDING FULL BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRY AT THE END OF YOUR WORK. THIS METHOD ALLOWS FOR A SEAMLESS READING EXPERIENCE WHILE MAINTAINING RIGOROUS SOURCE TRACKING.

THE FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLE OF THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM IS TO PROVIDE ENOUGH INFORMATION WITHIN THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION FOR A READER TO LOCATE THE FULL ENTRY IN YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY. THIS TYPICALLY INVOLVES THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE PUBLICATION YEAR OF THE SOURCE. WHEN THESE ARE INSUFFICIENT OR WHEN CITING MULTIPLE WORKS BY THE SAME AUTHOR IN THE SAME YEAR, ADDITIONAL INFORMATION MAY BE NECESSARY TO DIFFERENTIATE BETWEEN THEM. THE GOAL IS CLARITY AND EASE OF VERIFICATION FOR YOUR AUDIENCE.

CORE COMPONENTS OF A PARENTHETICAL CITATION

A CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATION, WHEN APPLIED TO ONLINE SOURCES, TYPICALLY INCLUDES THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION. IF NO AUTHOR IS LISTED, THE TITLE OF THE WORK (OR A SHORTENED VERSION) IS USED INSTEAD. THE PLACEMENT OF THE CITATION IS ALSO IMPORTANT; IT GENERALLY FOLLOWS THE QUOTE OR PARAPHRASE AND PRECEDES THE PUNCTUATION MARK OF THE SENTENCE.

THE MOST BASIC FORMAT IS (AUTHOR LAST NAME YEAR). FOR EXAMPLE, IF YOU ARE CITING A STUDY BY DR. ELEANOR VANCE PUBLISHED IN 2022, THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION WOULD BE (VANCE 2022). HOWEVER, THE SPECIFICS CAN VARY BASED ON THE NATURE OF THE ONLINE SOURCE AND THE INFORMATION AVAILABLE. UNDERSTANDING THESE VARIATIONS IS KEY TO ACCURATE CITATION.

WHEN NO AUTHOR IS AVAILABLE

MANY ONLINE SOURCES, SUCH AS WEB PAGES OR ARTICLES, MAY NOT HAVE A CLEARLY IDENTIFIED AUTHOR. IN SUCH CASES, CHICAGO STYLE DICTATES USING THE TITLE OF THE WORK, OR A SHORTENED VERSION OF IT, IN PLACE OF THE AUTHOR'S NAME. THE TITLE SHOULD BE ITALICIZED IF IT REFERS TO A STANDALONE WORK (LIKE A BOOK OR A STANDALONE WEBSITE) OR ENCLOSED IN QUOTATION MARKS IF IT REFERS TO A PART OF A LARGER WORK (LIKE AN ARTICLE ON A WEBSITE).

FOR INSTANCE, IF YOU ARE CITING AN ARTICLE TITLED "THE FUTURE OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE" PUBLISHED ON A WEBSITE IN 2023 WITHOUT AN AUTHOR LISTED, THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION WOULD LOOK LIKE THIS: ("FUTURE OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE" 2023). IF THE WEBSITE ITSELF IS THE SOURCE AND HAS NO AUTHOR, YOU MIGHT USE THE WEBSITE'S NAME: (GLOBAL NEWS NETWORK 2023). ALWAYS STRIVE TO USE THE MOST SPECIFIC IDENTIFYING INFORMATION AVAILABLE.

CITING MULTIPLE WORKS BY THE SAME AUTHOR

A COMMON CHALLENGE ARISES WHEN YOU CITE MULTIPLE WORKS BY THE SAME AUTHOR PUBLISHED IN THE SAME YEAR. TO DISTINGUISH THESE SOURCES IN YOUR PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS, CHICAGO STYLE REQUIRES ADDING LOWERCASE LETTERS TO THE YEAR. THE FIRST PUBLICATION IS FOLLOWED BY 'A', THE SECOND BY 'B', AND SO ON, AS THEY APPEAR IN YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY.

FOR EXAMPLE, IF DR. VANCE PUBLISHED TWO ARTICLES IN 2022, AND VANCE 2022A APPEARED FIRST IN YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY, FOLLOWED BY VANCE 2022B, YOUR PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS WOULD BE (VANCE 2022A) AND (VANCE 2022B) RESPECTIVELY. THIS ENSURES A CLEAR LINK BETWEEN THE IN-TEXT CITATION AND ITS CORRESPONDING BIBLIOGRAPHY ENTRY, PREVENTING AMBIGUITY.

WHEN NO DATE IS AVAILABLE

OCCASIONALLY, AN ONLINE SOURCE MAY NOT HAVE A PUBLICATION DATE. IN THESE INSTANCES, CHICAGO STYLE RECOMMENDS USING "N.D." (NO DATE) IN PLACE OF THE YEAR. THIS CLEARLY INDICATES TO THE READER THAT A DATE WAS NOT PROVIDED FOR THE SOURCE.

FOR EXAMPLE, IF YOU ARE CITING A WEB PAGE WITH NO PUBLICATION DATE, THE CITATION WOULD BE (AUTHOR LAST NAME N.D.). IF THERE IS NO AUTHOR EITHER, YOU WOULD USE THE SHORTENED TITLE FOLLOWED BY "N.D.": ("ARTICLE TITLE" N.D.). THIS PRACTICE MAINTAINS CONSISTENCY AND SIGNALS THE ABSENCE OF DATE INFORMATION.

CITING WEBSITES IN CHICAGO STYLE

WEBSITES ARE UBIQUITOUS SOURCES FOR RESEARCH, AND CITING THEM ACCURATELY IN CHICAGO STYLE REQUIRES ATTENTION TO DETAIL. THE CORE ELEMENTS REMAIN THE AUTHOR (OR WEBSITE NAME IF NO AUTHOR IS SPECIFIED) AND THE PUBLICATION YEAR. HOWEVER, THE STRUCTURE OF THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION CAN BE INFLUENCED BY THE SPECIFIC CONTENT YOU ARE REFERENCING.

WHEN REFERENCING A GENERAL WEBSITE OR A PAGE WITH NO CLEAR AUTHOR OR DATE, YOU WILL LIKELY RELY ON THE WEBSITE'S NAME AND "N.D." OR THE YEAR OF ACCESS IF A PUBLICATION YEAR IS UNAVAILABLE BUT AN ACCESS DATE IS RELEVANT. IT'S ALWAYS BEST TO CONSULT THE WEBSITE ITSELF FOR COPYRIGHT DATES OR "LAST UPDATED" INFORMATION.

CITING SPECIFIC PAGES ON A WEBSITE

FOR SPECIFIC PAGES WITHIN A LARGER WEBSITE, THE PRINCIPLE OF USING THE AUTHOR (OR ORGANIZATIONAL AUTHOR) AND PUBLICATION YEAR APPLIES. IF AN INDIVIDUAL AUTHOR IS CREDITED, USE THEIR LAST NAME. IF THE PAGE IS ATTRIBUTED TO AN

ORGANIZATION, USE THE ORGANIZATION'S NAME.

FOR EXAMPLE, IF YOU ARE CITING A PAGE AUTHORED BY "SMITH" ON THE "TECH INNOVATIONS" WEBSITE PUBLISHED IN 2021, THE CITATION WOULD BE (SMITH 2021). IF THE PAGE IS FROM AN ORGANIZATION LIKE THE "WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION" AND WAS PUBLISHED IN 2023, IT WOULD BE (WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION 2023).

CITING ORGANIZATIONAL AUTHORS

MANY WEBSITES ARE PRODUCED BY ORGANIZATIONS RATHER THAN INDIVIDUALS. IN THESE CASES, THE ORGANIZATION'S NAME SERVES AS THE AUTHOR. IT'S IMPORTANT TO USE THE FULL, OFFICIAL NAME OF THE ORGANIZATION FOR CONSISTENCY.

FOR INSTANCE, A REPORT FROM THE "UNITED NATIONS CHILDREN'S FUND" PUBLISHED IN 2022 WOULD BE CITED AS (UNITED NATIONS CHILDREN'S FUND 2022). BE MINDFUL OF ABBREVIATIONS; IT'S GENERALLY BEST TO USE THE FULL NAME IN THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION AND THEN, IF NECESSARY FOR BREVITY AND CLARITY, A COMMON ABBREVIATION IN SUBSEQUENT CITATIONS (AND EXPLICITLY DEFINED IN YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY).

CITING ONLINE ARTICLES

ONLINE ARTICLES, WHETHER FROM ACADEMIC JOURNALS, NEWSPAPERS, OR MAGAZINES, REQUIRE CAREFUL CITATION. THE KEY IS TO IDENTIFY THE AUTHOR, PUBLICATION DATE, AND THE TITLE OF THE ARTICLE ITSELF, OFTEN ALONGSIDE THE NAME OF THE PUBLICATION IT APPEARS IN.

FOR ARTICLES THAT ARE ESSENTIALLY DIGITAL VERSIONS OF PRINT ARTICLES, THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION MIGHT CLOSELY RESEMBLE THAT OF A PRINT ARTICLE, WITH THE ADDITION OF URL INFORMATION IN THE FULL BIBLIOGRAPHY ENTRY. HOWEVER, THE IN-TEXT CITATION FOCUSES ON AUTHOR AND YEAR.

JOURNAL ARTICLES ACCESSED ONLINE

WHEN CITING A JOURNAL ARTICLE ACCESSED ONLINE, IF IT HAS A PUBLICATION DATE, USE THAT DATE. THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE YEAR ARE PARAMOUNT FOR THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION.

FOR EXAMPLE, IF YOU ARE REFERENCING AN ARTICLE BY DR. ANYA SHARMA PUBLISHED IN THE "JOURNAL OF MODERN PSYCHOLOGY" IN 2023, THE CITATION WOULD BE (SHARMA 2023). THE FULL BIBLIOGRAPHY ENTRY WOULD INCLUDE THE JOURNAL TITLE, VOLUME, ISSUE, PAGE NUMBERS, AND THE URL OR DOI.

NEWSPAPER AND MAGAZINE ARTICLES ONLINE

NEWSPAPER AND MAGAZINE ARTICLES OFTEN HAVE MORE RECENT PUBLICATION DATES, AND SOMETIMES THE SPECIFIC DATE (MONTH AND DAY) IS IMPORTANT. HOWEVER, FOR THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION IN CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE STYLE, THE YEAR IS GENERALLY SUFFICIENT, UNLESS THERE ARE MULTIPLE ARTICLES BY THE SAME AUTHOR IN THE SAME YEAR.

IF YOU CITE AN ARTICLE BY JOHN DOE FROM THE "DAILY CHRONICLE" PUBLISHED ON JUNE 15, 2024, YOUR PARENTHETICAL CITATION WOULD BE (DOE 2024). THE FULL BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRY WOULD THEN INCLUDE THE FULL DATE.

CITING MULTIMEDIA AND OTHER ONLINE SOURCES

THE DIGITAL LANDSCAPE EXTENDS FAR BEYOND TEXT-BASED ARTICLES. VIDEOS, PODCASTS, SOCIAL MEDIA POSTS, AND OTHER MULTIMEDIA CONTENT ALL REQUIRE PROPER CITATION WHEN USED IN ACADEMIC WORK.

THE PRINCIPLES OF AUTHOR-DATE CITATION REMAIN CONSISTENT, BUT IDENTIFYING THE "AUTHOR" AND "DATE" CAN SOMETIMES BE MORE COMPLEX FOR THESE FORMATS. FOR VIDEOS, THE CREATOR OR UPLOADER OFTEN SERVES AS THE AUTHOR. FOR PODCASTS, IT MIGHT BE THE HOST OR PRODUCER. SOCIAL MEDIA POSTS ARE PARTICULARLY CHALLENGING DUE TO THEIR EPHEMERAL NATURE AND LACK OF FORMAL PUBLICATION DATES.

CITING VIDEOS AND PODCASTS

FOR ONLINE VIDEOS (E.G., YOUTUBE, VIMEO) AND PODCASTS, IDENTIFY THE CREATOR OR HOST AS THE AUTHOR AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION OR UPLOAD. IF A SPECIFIC TIMESTAMP IS CRUCIAL FOR A QUOTE OR REFERENCE, YOU CAN INCLUDE IT IN THE TEXT, BUT IT DOESN'T TYPICALLY GO INTO THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION ITSELF.

FOR EXAMPLE, CITING A TED TALK BY DR. EMILY CARTER UPLOADED IN 2023: (CARTER 2023). FOR A PODCAST EPISODE HOSTED BY "THE SCIENCE HOUR" RELEASED IN 2022: (THE SCIENCE HOUR 2022). ENSURE YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY ENTRY PROVIDES ENOUGH DETAIL TO LOCATE THE SPECIFIC VIDEO OR EPISODE.

CITING SOCIAL MEDIA AND BLOGS

CITING SOCIAL MEDIA POSTS AND BLOG ENTRIES REQUIRES CAREFUL CONSIDERATION, ESPECIALLY REGARDING THEIR RELIABILITY AND PERMANENCE. THE AUTHOR IS TYPICALLY THE USER OR BLOG OWNER, AND THE DATE OF THE POST IS CRUCIAL.

IF YOU CITE A TWEET FROM @USEREXAMPLE POSTED IN 2024, YOUR PARENTHETICAL CITATION MIGHT BE (@USEREXAMPLE 2024) OR, IF THE USER'S NAME IS KNOWN AND PREFERRED, (USERNAME LAST NAME 2024). FOR A BLOG POST BY JANE DOE FROM 2023, IT WOULD BE (DOE 2023). ALWAYS CONFIRM WITH YOUR INSTRUCTOR OR EDITOR ABOUT THE ACCEPTABILITY OF SUCH SOURCES.

COMMON PITFALLS AND BEST PRACTICES FOR ONLINE CITATIONS

NAVIGATING THE COMPLEXITIES OF CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATION FOR ONLINE SOURCES CAN LEAD TO COMMON ERRORS. AWARENESS OF THESE PITFALLS AND ADHERENCE TO BEST PRACTICES CAN SIGNIFICANTLY IMPROVE THE ACCURACY AND PROFESSIONALISM OF YOUR WORK.

ONE FREQUENT ISSUE IS INCONSISTENCY. ENSURE THAT THE AUTHOR'S NAME AND YEAR IN YOUR PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS PRECISELY MATCH THE CORRESPONDING ENTRIES IN YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY. ANOTHER COMMON PROBLEM IS OVERLOOKING THE NEED TO CITE WHEN INFORMATION IS READILY AVAILABLE ONLINE. IF IT'S NOT COMMON KNOWLEDGE, IT NEEDS A CITATION.

MAINTAINING CONSISTENCY AND ACCURACY

THE GOLDEN RULE FOR ALL CITATIONS, INCLUDING CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL EXAMPLES ONLINE, IS CONSISTENCY. THIS MEANS USING THE SAME FORMAT FOR ALL SOURCES OF A SIMILAR TYPE AND ENSURING THAT EVERY IN-TEXT CITATION HAS A CORRESPONDING ENTRY IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHY, AND VICE VERSA.

ALWAYS DOUBLE-CHECK AUTHOR NAMES, DATES, AND ANY OTHER IDENTIFYING INFORMATION AGAINST YOUR SOURCE MATERIAL. IF YOU ARE UNSURE ABOUT THE EXACT PUBLICATION DATE, USE "N.D." RATHER THAN GUESSING. FOR TITLES, ENSURE PROPER CAPITALIZATION AND FORMATTING (ITALICS OR QUOTATION MARKS) AS DICTATED BY CHICAGO STYLE.

USING TOOLS WISELY

WHILE CITATION MANAGEMENT TOOLS CAN BE HELPFUL, THEY ARE NOT INFALLIBLE. RELYING SOLELY ON THESE TOOLS WITHOUT UNDERSTANDING THE UNDERLYING PRINCIPLES OF CHICAGO STYLE CAN LEAD TO ERRORS, PARTICULARLY WITH LESS COMMON ONLINE SOURCE TYPES.

IT IS ALWAYS RECOMMENDED TO REVIEW AND MANUALLY VERIFY THE CITATIONS GENERATED BY ANY SOFTWARE. FAMILIARIZE YOURSELF WITH THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE GUIDELINES FOR ONLINE RESOURCES TO ENSURE YOUR WORK MEETS THE HIGHEST ACADEMIC STANDARDS. THE INVESTMENT IN UNDERSTANDING THESE RULES WILL PAY DIVIDENDS IN THE CLARITY AND CREDIBILITY OF YOUR RESEARCH.

BY DILIGENTLY APPLYING THESE PRINCIPLES, YOU CAN CONFIDENTLY AND ACCURATELY CITE A WIDE RANGE OF ONLINE RESOURCES USING THE CHICAGO STYLE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM. THIS METICULOUS APPROACH NOT ONLY UPHOLDS ACADEMIC INTEGRITY BUT ALSO ENHANCES THE OVERALL QUALITY AND TRUSTWORTHINESS OF YOUR SCHOLARLY ENDEAVORS.

Q: WHAT IS THE FUNDAMENTAL DIFFERENCE BETWEEN CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATION AND FOOTNOTE CITATION?

A: THE FUNDAMENTAL DIFFERENCE LIES IN THEIR PLACEMENT AND FORMAT. CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATION EMBEDS BRIEF REFERENCES (AUTHOR-DATE) DIRECTLY WITHIN THE TEXT, POINTING TO A FULL BIBLIOGRAPHY AT THE END. FOOTNOTE CITATION, CONVERSELY, USES NUMBERED ENDNOTES OR FOOTNOTES AT THE BOTTOM OF THE PAGE OR END OF THE DOCUMENT, CONTAINING MORE DETAILED CITATION INFORMATION, AND A BIBLIOGRAPHY IS ALSO TYPICALLY REQUIRED.

Q: HOW DO I CITE A WEBSITE IN CHICAGO STYLE IF THERE'S NO AUTHOR AND NO DATE?

A: IF A WEBSITE LACKS BOTH AN AUTHOR AND A PUBLICATION DATE, YOU SHOULD USE A SHORTENED VERSION OF THE WEBSITE'S TITLE IN ITALICS IN PLACE OF THE AUTHOR, FOLLOWED BY "N.D." (NO DATE) FOR THE YEAR. FOR EXAMPLE: (*WEBSITE NAME ABOUT TOPIC* N.D.).

Q: WHAT IF I'M QUOTING DIRECTLY FROM A WEB PAGE IN CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATION?

A: WHEN QUOTING DIRECTLY FROM A WEB PAGE IN CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATION, YOU STILL USE THE AUTHOR (OR SHORTENED TITLE) AND YEAR. IF THE PAGE INCLUDES PARAGRAPH OR SECTION NUMBERS, THESE CAN BE INCLUDED AFTER THE YEAR TO HELP READERS LOCATE THE EXACT PASSAGE, E.G., (SMITH 2023, PAR. 5) OR (DOE 2022, SEC. 3).

Q: HOW DO I CITE MULTIPLE SOURCES BY THE SAME AUTHOR IN THE SAME YEAR USING CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATION FOR ONLINE RESOURCES?

A: TO CITE MULTIPLE SOURCES BY THE SAME AUTHOR PUBLISHED IN THE SAME YEAR, YOU ADD LOWERCASE LETTERS (A, B, C, ETC.) TO THE YEAR IN YOUR PARENTHETICAL CITATION. THE ORDER OF THESE LETTERS SHOULD CORRESPOND TO THE ORDER IN WHICH THE SOURCES APPEAR IN YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY. FOR EXAMPLE: (VANCE 2023A) AND (VANCE 2023B).

Q: IS IT ACCEPTABLE TO USE A WEBSITE'S URL IN A CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATION FOR ONLINE EXAMPLES?

A: No, URLs ARE GENERALLY NOT INCLUDED IN THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION ITSELF IN CHICAGO STYLE'S AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM. THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION IS INTENDED TO BE BRIEF, CONTAINING ONLY THE AUTHOR (OR SHORTENED TITLE) AND THE YEAR. THE FULL URL IS PROVIDED IN THE CORRESPONDING BIBLIOGRAPHY ENTRY.

Q: HOW SHOULD I CITE A SOCIAL MEDIA POST IN CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATION FOR ONLINE CITATION EXAMPLES?

A: CITING SOCIAL MEDIA POSTS IN CHICAGO STYLE REQUIRES IDENTIFYING THE USER AS THE AUTHOR AND THE YEAR OF THE POST. IF THE USER'S REAL NAME IS KNOWN, IT'S PREFERABLE TO USE THAT. IF NOT, THE USERNAME CAN BE USED. FOR EXAMPLE: (DOE 2024) OR (@USERNAME 2024). THE FULL CITATION IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHY WILL INCLUDE THE PLATFORM AND THE DATE.

Q: WHAT IS THE ROLE OF THE BIBLIOGRAPHY IN CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATION FOR ONLINE SOURCES?

A: THE BIBLIOGRAPHY IS AN ESSENTIAL COMPANION TO CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS. IT PROVIDES THE COMPLETE BIBLIOGRAPHIC INFORMATION FOR EACH SOURCE CITED IN THE TEXT, ALLOWING READERS TO LOCATE AND VERIFY THE ORIGINAL MATERIAL. EACH PARENTHETICAL CITATION SHOULD CORRESPOND TO A UNIQUE ENTRY IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHY.

Q: CAN I USE AN ACCESS DATE IN A CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATION FOR ONLINE RESOURCES?

A: GENERALLY, CHICAGO STYLE'S AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM PRIORITIZES THE PUBLICATION DATE OVER THE ACCESS DATE. AN ACCESS DATE IS TYPICALLY ONLY USED IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHY IF A PUBLICATION DATE CANNOT BE DETERMINED, OR IF THE SOURCE IS LIKELY TO CHANGE FREQUENTLY (THOUGH EVEN THEN, IT'S OFTEN USED IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE PUBLICATION DATE IF AVAILABLE). IT IS NOT TYPICALLY INCLUDED IN THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION.

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
