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UNDERSTANDING THE TWO CHICAGO STYLE SYSTEMS

THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE (CMOS) OFFERS TWO PRIMARY CITATION SYSTEMS, EACH SUITED TO DIFFERENT ACADEMIC FIELDS AND PUBLICATION TYPES. THE CHOICE BETWEEN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM AND THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM OFTEN DEPENDS ON THE CONVENTIONS OF THE DISCIPLINE AND THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE PUBLISHER. BOTH SYSTEMS AIM TO PROVIDE CLEAR AND CONSISTENT ATTRIBUTION OF SOURCES, BUT THEY DIFFER IN THEIR PRESENTATION OF CITATIONS WITHIN THE TEXT AND IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHY OR REFERENCE LIST.

THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM IS MORE COMMON IN HUMANITIES DISCIPLINES SUCH AS LITERATURE, HISTORY, AND ART HISTORY. IT USES NUMBERED NOTES (FOOTNOTES OR ENDNOTES) TO CITE SOURCES, ALLOWING FOR DETAILED COMMENTARY AND MULTIPLE REFERENCES TO THE SAME SOURCE WITHOUT DISRUPTING THE FLOW OF THE MAIN TEXT. THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, PREVALENT IN THE SOCIAL SCIENCES AND NATURAL SCIENCES, USES BRIEF IN-TEXT PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS THAT REFER TO A FULL ENTRY IN A CORRESPONDING REFERENCE LIST AT THE END OF THE WORK. UNDERSTANDING WHICH SYSTEM TO EMPLOY IS THE FIRST CRITICAL STEP IN MASTERING CHICAGO STYLE RULES.

THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM

THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM IS FAVORED FOR ITS FLEXIBILITY IN INCORPORATING EXTENSIVE EXPLANATORY NOTES ALONGSIDE SOURCE ATTRIBUTION. WHEN USING THIS SYSTEM, WRITERS PLACE A SUPERScript NUMBER AT THE END OF A SENTENCE, CLAUSE, OR PHRASE THAT REFERS TO A SOURCE. THESE NUMBERS CORRESPOND TO SEQUENTIAL NOTES AT THE BOTTOM OF THE PAGE (FOOTNOTES) OR AT THE END OF THE DOCUMENT (ENDNOTES).

FOOTNOTES VS. ENDNOTES

FOOTNOTES APPEAR AT THE BOTTOM OF THE PAGE WHERE THE CITATION OCCURS, MAKING IT EASY FOR READERS TO CONSULT THE SOURCE INFORMATION WITHOUT LEAVING THE PAGE. ENDNOTES, CONVERSELY, ARE COMPILED AT THE END OF THE CHAPTER OR THE ENTIRE WORK. WHILE BOTH SERVE THE SAME PURPOSE, ENDNOTES CAN SOMETIMES OFFER A CLEANER PAGE LAYOUT. CHICAGO STYLE RULES PERMIT EITHER, BUT CONSISTENCY IS PARAMOUNT.

FIRST REFERENCE AND SUBSEQUENT REFERENCES

THE FIRST TIME A SOURCE IS CITED IN A NOTE, THE FULL BIBLIOGRAPHIC INFORMATION IS PROVIDED. THIS INCLUDES THE AUTHOR'S FULL NAME, THE TITLE OF THE WORK (ITALICIZED FOR BOOKS, IN QUOTATION MARKS FOR ARTICLES), PUBLICATION DETAILS, AND PAGE NUMBER(S). SUBSEQUENT REFERENCES TO THE SAME SOURCE ARE SHORTENED, TYPICALLY INCLUDING ONLY THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME, A SHORTENED TITLE, AND THE PAGE NUMBER. THIS CONVENTION STREAMLINES THE NOTES SECTION AND HIGHLIGHTS THE ESSENTIAL IDENTIFYING DETAILS OF FREQUENTLY CITED WORKS.

THE BIBLIOGRAPHY

A BIBLIOGRAPHY, OR REFERENCE LIST, IS ALWAYS INCLUDED AT THE END OF A WORK THAT USES THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM. THIS LIST PROVIDES A COMPLETE ALPHABETICAL LISTING OF ALL SOURCES CITED IN THE NOTES, FORMATTED IN A CONSISTENT MANNER. IT SERVES AS A COMPREHENSIVE GUIDE FOR READERS WHO WISH TO LOCATE AND CONSULT THE ORIGINAL MATERIALS. THE FORMAT OF ENTRIES IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHY MIRRORS THE INFORMATION PROVIDED IN THE FIRST NOTE BUT OMITTS THE NOTE NUMBER.

THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM

THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM PRIORITIZES CONCISENESS WITHIN THE MAIN BODY OF THE TEXT, RELYING ON PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS THAT IMMEDIATELY FOLLOW THE MATERIAL BEING REFERENCED. THIS METHOD IS HIGHLY EFFICIENT FOR WORKS WHERE THE READER NEEDS TO QUICKLY IDENTIFY THE SOURCE OF SPECIFIC INFORMATION WITHOUT EXTENSIVE TEXTUAL INTERRUPTION.

IN-TEXT CITATIONS

IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, IN-TEXT CITATIONS TYPICALLY INCLUDE THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME, THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION, AND THE PAGE NUMBER(S) IF APPLICABLE, ALL ENCLOSED IN PARENTHESES. FOR EXAMPLE: (SMITH 2020, 15). IF THE AUTHOR'S NAME IS ALREADY MENTIONED IN THE SENTENCE, ONLY THE YEAR AND PAGE NUMBER ARE NEEDED: SMITH (2020, 15) ARGUES THAT... THIS DIRECT ATTRIBUTION ENSURES THAT READERS CAN IMMEDIATELY TRACE INFORMATION BACK TO ITS ORIGIN.

THE REFERENCE LIST

CORRESPONDING TO THE IN-TEXT CITATIONS, A REFERENCE LIST IS PROVIDED AT THE END OF THE DOCUMENT. THIS LIST IS ALPHABETIZED BY THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND INCLUDES FULL BIBLIOGRAPHIC DETAILS FOR EVERY SOURCE CITED IN THE TEXT. UNLIKE THE BIBLIOGRAPHY IN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, THE REFERENCE LIST IS TYPICALLY PRESENTED IN A SLIGHTLY DIFFERENT FORMAT TO ACCOMMODATE THE AUTHOR-DATE STRUCTURE, OFTEN WITH THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION PLACED IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE AUTHOR'S NAME. ADHERING TO THESE SPECIFIC FORMATTING NUANCES IS CRUCIAL FOR ACCURATE APPLICATION OF CHICAGO STYLE RULES.

CITATION ESSENTIALS: IN-TEXT AND END MATTER

REGARDLESS OF THE CHOSEN CITATION SYSTEM, CONSISTENCY AND ACCURACY IN PRESENTING SOURCE INFORMATION ARE PARAMOUNT. THE GOAL OF ANY CITATION SYSTEM IS TO GIVE CREDIT WHERE CREDIT IS DUE AND TO ENABLE READERS TO FIND THE SOURCES THEMSELVES. CHICAGO STYLE RULES PROVIDE DETAILED INSTRUCTIONS FOR A WIDE RANGE OF SOURCE TYPES.

Books

CITING A BOOK IN CHICAGO STYLE RULES TYPICALLY INVOLVES THE AUTHOR'S NAME, THE TITLE OF THE BOOK (ITALICIZED), THE PUBLISHER, AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION. FOR NOTES, PAGE NUMBERS ARE INCLUDED. FOR EXAMPLE, A NOTE MIGHT LOOK LIKE: JOHN SMITH, *THE HISTORY OF WRITING* (NEW YORK: ACADEMIC PRESS, 2019), 45. IN AN AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, THE IN-TEXT CITATION WOULD BE (SMITH 2019, 45).

JOURNAL ARTICLES

JOURNAL ARTICLES REQUIRE SPECIFIC FORMATTING THAT INCLUDES THE AUTHOR'S NAME, THE ARTICLE TITLE (IN QUOTATION MARKS), THE JOURNAL TITLE (ITALICIZED), THE VOLUME AND ISSUE NUMBERS, THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION, AND THE PAGE RANGE OF THE ARTICLE. FOR INSTANCE, A NOTE COULD BE: JANE DOE, "THE EVOLUTION OF DIGITAL MEDIA," *JOURNAL OF COMMUNICATION STUDIES* 25, no. 3 (2021): 112-130. THE CORRESPONDING IN-TEXT CITATION FOR THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM WOULD BE (DOE 2021, 115).

ONLINE RESOURCES

CITING ONLINE RESOURCES IN CHICAGO STYLE RULES NECESSITATES INCLUDING INFORMATION SUCH AS THE AUTHOR (IF AVAILABLE), THE TITLE OF THE WEBPAGE OR ARTICLE, THE NAME OF THE WEBSITE, THE DATE OF PUBLICATION OR LAST UPDATE, AND A STABLE URL. FOR OLDER ONLINE CONTENT WITHOUT CLEAR PUBLICATION DATES, THE ACCESS DATE IS ALSO OFTEN INCLUDED. THE PRECISE DETAILS CAN VARY, EMPHASIZING THE NEED TO CONSULT THE LATEST EDITION OF THE MANUAL FOR THE MOST CURRENT GUIDANCE ON DIGITAL CITATIONS.

PUNCTUATION AND GRAMMAR ACCORDING TO CHICAGO STYLE RULES

BEYOND CITATION, CHICAGO STYLE RULES OFFER COMPREHENSIVE GUIDANCE ON PUNCTUATION, SPELLING, AND GRAMMATICAL CONVENTIONS. THESE RULES ARE DESIGNED TO ENHANCE CLARITY, READABILITY, AND PROFESSIONALISM IN WRITTEN WORK.

COMMAS

CHICAGO STYLE RULES GENERALLY FAVOR THE USE OF THE SERIAL COMMA (ALSO KNOWN AS THE OXFORD COMMA) IN A SERIES OF THREE OR MORE ITEMS. FOR EXAMPLE: APPLES, ORANGES, AND BANANAS. HOWEVER, THE MANUAL ALLOWS FOR EXCEPTIONS WHEN CLARITY IS MAINTAINED WITHOUT IT. PROPER COMMA USAGE IS ALSO ESSENTIAL IN INTRODUCTORY CLAUSES, NONRESTRICTIVE PHRASES, AND COMPOUND SENTENCES TO PREVENT AMBIGUITY.

Quotation Marks

CHICAGO STYLE RULES DICTATE THE PLACEMENT OF PUNCTUATION WITH QUOTATION MARKS. PERIODS AND COMMAS ARE ALMOST ALWAYS PLACED INSIDE THE CLOSING QUOTATION MARK. COLONS AND SEMICOLONS ARE PLACED OUTSIDE, WHILE QUESTION MARKS AND EXCLAMATION POINTS ARE PLACED INSIDE OR OUTSIDE DEPENDING ON WHETHER THEY ARE PART OF THE QUOTED MATERIAL ITSELF. THIS RULE ENSURES A CONSISTENT AND LOGICAL FLOW WHEN INTEGRATING QUOTES INTO TEXT.

Hyphenation and Compound Words

THE MANUAL PROVIDES EXTENSIVE GUIDELINES ON WHEN TO HYPHENATE WORDS, PARTICULARLY COMPOUND MODIFIERS PRECEDING A NOUN (E.G., STATE-OF-THE-ART TECHNOLOGY). IT ALSO ADDRESSES THE FORMATION AND SPELLING OF COMPOUND WORDS, DISTINGUISHING BETWEEN OPEN COMPOUNDS, HYPHENATED COMPOUNDS, AND CLOSED COMPOUNDS. CONSULTING THE DICTIONARY AND THE MANUAL IS OFTEN NECESSARY FOR CORRECT USAGE.

Capitalization

CHICAGO STYLE RULES OFFER SPECIFIC GUIDANCE ON CAPITALIZATION FOR TITLES OF WORKS, HEADINGS, AND PROPER NOUNS. FOR TITLES, IT GENERALLY FOLLOWS THE "TITLE CASE" CONVENTION, CAPITALIZING THE FIRST WORD AND ALL PRINCIPAL WORDS. FOR HEADINGS AND SUBHEADINGS, THE MANUAL OFTEN RECOMMENDS SENTENCE CASE OR TITLE CASE DEPENDING ON THE CONTEXT AND THE SPECIFIC PUBLICATION'S STYLE SHEET. CONSISTENCY IN CAPITALIZATION IS KEY TO MAINTAINING A PROFESSIONAL APPEARANCE.

Manuscript Preparation and Submission

FOR AUTHORS PREPARING MANUSCRIPTS FOR PUBLICATION, UNDERSTANDING THE PHYSICAL AND STRUCTURAL REQUIREMENTS OF CHICAGO STYLE RULES IS AS IMPORTANT AS MASTERING THE CITATION AND GRAMMATICAL ASPECTS. ADHERING TO THESE STANDARDS ENSURES THAT A MANUSCRIPT IS PROFESSIONAL AND READILY DIGESTIBLE BY EDITORS AND TYPESETTERS.

Formatting Standards

MANUSCRIPTS SUBMITTED UNDER CHICAGO STYLE RULES TYPICALLY REQUIRE DOUBLE-SPACING THROUGHOUT, INCLUDING BLOCK QUOTATIONS AND BIBLIOGRAPHIES. MARGINS SHOULD BE GENEROUS, USUALLY ONE INCH ON ALL SIDES, TO ALLOW FOR EDITORIAL MARKINGS. FONT CHOICE IS GENERALLY LEFT TO THE AUTHOR'S DISCRETION, BUT A STANDARD, READABLE TYPEFACE LIKE TIMES NEW ROMAN OR ARIAL IN 12-POINT SIZE IS RECOMMENDED. PAGE NUMBERS SHOULD BE INCLUDED, TYPICALLY IN THE UPPER RIGHT-HAND CORNER OF EACH PAGE.

Block Quotations

LONGER QUOTATIONS, GENERALLY THOSE EXCEEDING FOUR TYPED LINES, SHOULD BE PRESENTED AS BLOCK QUOTATIONS. THIS INVOLVES INDENTING THE ENTIRE QUOTATION FROM THE LEFT MARGIN AND OMITTING THE QUOTATION MARKS. THE CITATION FOLLOWS THE QUOTATION, USUALLY WITHOUT INTRODUCTORY PUNCTUATION. THIS FORMATTING VISUALLY SEPARATES QUOTED MATERIAL FROM THE AUTHOR'S OWN PROSE, ENHANCING READABILITY AND DISTINGUISHING AUTHORITATIVE VOICES.

TABLES AND FIGURES

WHEN INCORPORATING TABLES AND FIGURES, CHICAGO STYLE RULES PROVIDE GUIDELINES FOR THEIR NUMBERING, TITLING, AND PLACEMENT. TABLES ARE TYPICALLY PRESENTED WITH COLUMN AND ROW HEADINGS, WHILE FIGURES MAY INCLUDE CAPTIONS. EACH TABLE AND FIGURE SHOULD BE CLEARLY REFERENCED IN THE TEXT. CONSISTENCY IN FORMATTING AND LABELING IS CRUCIAL FOR CLARITY AND PROFESSIONAL PRESENTATION.

COMMON PITFALLS AND HOW TO AVOID THEM

NAVIGATING CHICAGO STYLE RULES CAN PRESENT CHALLENGES, AND CERTAIN ERRORS ARE MORE COMMON THAN OTHERS. AWARENESS OF THESE POTENTIAL PITFALLS CAN SIGNIFICANTLY IMPROVE THE QUALITY AND ACCURACY OF YOUR WRITING.

- **INCONSISTENT APPLICATION OF CITATION STYLE:** ENSURE YOU ARE CONSISTENTLY USING EITHER THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY OR AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM THROUGHOUT YOUR ENTIRE WORK. MIXING ELEMENTS FROM BOTH CAN LEAD TO CONFUSION AND ERRORS.
- **INCORRECT PUNCTUATION WITH QUOTATION MARKS:** PAY CLOSE ATTENTION TO THE RULES FOR PLACING PERIODS, COMMAS, COLONS, SEMICOLONS, QUESTION MARKS, AND EXCLAMATION POINTS RELATIVE TO QUOTATION MARKS.
- **ERRORS IN BIBLIOGRAPHY OR REFERENCE LIST FORMATTING:** DOUBLE-CHECK THAT ALL ENTRIES ARE COMPLETE, ACCURATE, AND FORMATTED ACCORDING TO THE SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS FOR EACH SOURCE TYPE. ALPHABETICAL ORDER IS ALSO CRITICAL.
- **OVERUSE OR UNDERUSE OF NOTES IN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM:** NOTES SHOULD BE USED FOR CITATIONS AND SUBSTANTIVE COMMENTARY, NOT FOR PERSONAL ASIDES OR TO PAD CONTENT.
- **MISMATCHED IN-TEXT CITATIONS AND END MATTER IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM:** EVERY IN-TEXT CITATION MUST HAVE A CORRESPONDING ENTRY IN THE REFERENCE LIST, AND VICE VERSA.

THE BEST WAY TO AVOID THESE COMMON ISSUES IS TO CONSULT THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE DIRECTLY, REFER TO REPUTABLE STYLE GUIDES THAT SUMMARIZE ITS RULES, AND PROOFREAD METICULOUSLY. SEEKING FEEDBACK FROM PEERS OR EDITORS CAN ALSO PROVIDE VALUABLE INSIGHTS AND CATCH ERRORS YOU MIGHT HAVE MISSED.

THE IMPORTANCE OF A STYLE SHEET

FOR LARGER PROJECTS OR PUBLICATIONS WITH SPECIFIC STYLISTIC REQUIREMENTS, CREATING OR FOLLOWING A STYLE SHEET IS HIGHLY BENEFICIAL. A STYLE SHEET IS A DOCUMENT THAT OUTLINES THE SPECIFIC CHOICES MADE REGARDING GRAMMAR, PUNCTUATION, CAPITALIZATION, AND FORMATTING THAT DEViate FROM OR EXPAND UPON THE GENERAL RULES OF CHICAGO STYLE. THIS ENSURES CONSISTENCY ACROSS ALL CONTRIBUTORS AND THROUGHOUT THE ENTIRE PUBLICATION.

FOR INSTANCE, A STYLE SHEET MIGHT SPECIFY HOW TO HANDLE HYPHENATION FOR CERTAIN COMPOUND WORDS NOT COVERED BY THE MANUAL, DECIDE ON THE PREFERRED FORMAT FOR DATES, OR DICTATE THE EXACT APPEARANCE OF HEADINGS. BY HAVING THESE DECISIONS DOCUMENTED, WRITERS, EDITORS, AND DESIGNERS CAN WORK MORE EFFICIENTLY AND PRODUCE A MORE COHESIVE FINAL PRODUCT THAT STRICTLY ADHERES TO ESTABLISHED CHICAGO STYLE RULES.

CONTINUOUS LEARNING AND UPDATES

THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE IS UPDATED PERIODICALLY TO REFLECT CHANGES IN LANGUAGE, PUBLISHING PRACTICES, AND THE PROLIFERATION OF NEW MEDIA. WHILE THE CORE PRINCIPLES REMAIN CONSTANT, IT IS ESSENTIAL FOR WRITERS AND EDITORS TO BE AWARE OF THE LATEST EDITION. STAYING INFORMED ABOUT THESE UPDATES ENSURES THAT YOUR WRITING ADHERES TO THE MOST CURRENT AND AUTHORITATIVE CHICAGO STYLE RULES, MAINTAINING YOUR CREDIBILITY AND THE PROFESSIONALISM OF YOUR WORK.

FAQ

Q: WHAT IS THE PRIMARY DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM AND THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: THE PRIMARY DIFFERENCE LIES IN HOW SOURCES ARE CITED WITHIN THE TEXT. Q: WHEN SHOULD I USE THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM VERSUS THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM?

A: THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM IS GENERALLY PREFERRED IN THE HUMANITIES (E.G., LITERATURE, HISTORY, ART HISTORY) DUE TO ITS FLEXIBILITY WITH EXPLANATORY NOTES. THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM IS MORE COMMON IN THE SOCIAL SCIENCES AND NATURAL SCIENCES WHERE CONCISE IN-TEXT CITATIONS ARE FAVORED. ALWAYS CHECK THE SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS OF YOUR PUBLISHER OR INSTITUTION.

Q: DOES CHICAGO STYLE REQUIRE A SERIAL COMMA?

A: YES, CHICAGO STYLE GENERALLY ADVOCATES FOR THE USE OF THE SERIAL COMMA (ALSO KNOWN AS THE OXFORD COMMA) IN A SERIES OF THREE OR MORE ITEMS. FOR EXAMPLE: RED, WHITE, AND BLUE. HOWEVER, THE MANUAL ALLOWS FOR EXCEPTIONS WHEN ITS OMISSION DOES NOT CREATE AMBIGUITY.

Q: HOW ARE BLOCK QUOTATIONS FORMATTED IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: BLOCK QUOTATIONS, TYPICALLY LONGER THAN FOUR TYPED LINES, ARE FORMATTED BY INDENTING THE ENTIRE QUOTATION FROM THE LEFT MARGIN AND OMITTING THE QUOTATION MARKS. THE CITATION FOLLOWS THE QUOTATION, USUALLY WITHOUT INTRODUCTORY PUNCTUATION.

Q: WHAT INFORMATION IS REQUIRED FOR CITING A BOOK IN A CHICAGO STYLE NOTE?

A: FOR A FIRST NOTE REFERENCE TO A BOOK, YOU TYPICALLY INCLUDE THE AUTHOR'S FULL NAME, THE BOOK'S TITLE (ITALICIZED), THE PLACE OF PUBLICATION, THE PUBLISHER, THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION, AND THE SPECIFIC PAGE NUMBER(S) CITED.

Q: HOW DO I CITE AN ONLINE ARTICLE IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: CITING AN ONLINE ARTICLE INVOLVES PROVIDING THE AUTHOR'S NAME (IF AVAILABLE), THE ARTICLE TITLE (IN QUOTATION MARKS), THE WEBSITE NAME (ITALICIZED), THE PUBLICATION DATE (OR LAST UPDATED DATE), AND A STABLE URL. FOR OLDER ONLINE CONTENT, AN ACCESS DATE MAY ALSO BE INCLUDED.

Q: IS IT PERMISSIBLE TO USE ENDNOTES INSTEAD OF FOOTNOTES IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: YES, CHICAGO STYLE RULES PERMIT THE USE OF EITHER ENDNOTES OR FOOTNOTES FOR CITATIONS. THE CHOICE BETWEEN THEM IS OFTEN A MATTER OF EDITORIAL PREFERENCE OR PUBLICATION DESIGN, BUT CONSISTENCY WITHIN A SINGLE WORK IS ESSENTIAL.

Q: WHAT IS THE TYPICAL MARGIN SIZE RECOMMENDED BY CHICAGO STYLE FOR MANUSCRIPTS?

A: CHICAGO STYLE GENERALLY RECOMMENDS MARGINS OF AT LEAST ONE INCH ON ALL SIDES OF THE PAGE FOR MANUSCRIPTS. THIS PROVIDES AMPLE SPACE FOR EDITORIAL MARKINGS AND ENSURES A CLEAN, READABLE LAYOUT.

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
