THE PROLETARIAT: THE MODERN WORKING CLASS

CLASS CONSCIOUSNESS

IT IS THIS AWAKENED CONSCIOUSNESS THAT EMPOWERS THE PROLETARIAT TO RECOGNIZE ITS POTENTIAL AS A REVOLUTIONARY FORCE AND TO ACT COLLECTIVELY

TO OVERTHROW THE BOURGEOISIE. WITHOUT CLASS CONSCIOUSNESS, THE PROLETARIAT REMAINS MERELY A COLLECTION OF INDIVIDUALS EXPLOITED BY THE CAPITALIST SYSTEM.

ALIENATION

WHILE NOT EXPLICITLY USING THE TERM "ALIENATION" AS EXTENSIVELY AS IN HIS LATER WORKS, CHAPTER 1 IMPLICITLY ADDRESSES THE CONCEPT THROUGH ITS DEPICTION OF THE PROLETARIAT'S CONDITION. ALIENATION, IN MARXIST TERMS, REFERS TO THE ESTRANGEMENT OF INDIVIDUALS FROM THEIR LABOR, THE PRODUCTS OF THEIR LABOR, THEMSELVES, AND THEIR FELLOW HUMAN BEINGS. UNDER CAPITALISM, WORKERS ARE ALIENATED BECAUSE THEY DO NOT OWN THE MEANS OF PRODUCTION OR THE FRUITS OF THEIR LABOR. THEIR WORK IS OFTEN REPETITIVE AND UNFULFILLING, SERVING THE PROFIT MOTIVES OF OTHERS RATHER THAN THEIR OWN CREATIVE EXPRESSION. THE CAPITALIST SYSTEM, AS DESCRIBED IN CHAPTER 1, REDUCES HUMAN BEINGS TO MERE INSTRUMENTS OF PRODUCTION, STRIPPING THEM OF THEIR INHERENT DIGNITY AND SELF-WORTH. THIS UNDERLYING SENSE OF ESTRANGEMENT IS A CONTRIBUTING FACTOR TO THE PROLETARIAT'S EVENTUAL DESIRE FOR A SOCIETY THAT OVERCOMES SUCH DEHUMANIZING CONDITIONS.

CRITIQUES AND INTERPRETATIONS OF CHAPTER 1
