

AFGHANISTAN US ROLE

UNDERSTANDING THE AFGHANISTAN US ROLE: A HISTORICAL OVERVIEW

THE UNITED STATES' ENGAGEMENT IN AFGHANISTAN IS A NARRATIVE MARKED BY PROFOUND STRATEGIC SHIFTS, IMMENSE HUMAN AND FINANCIAL COSTS, AND ENDURING CONSEQUENCES. FROM THE INITIAL RESPONSE TO THE SEPTEMBER 11TH ATTACKS, THE US ROLE IN AFGHANISTAN WAS DESIGNED TO DISMANTLE TERRORIST ORGANIZATIONS AND PREVENT AFGHANISTAN FROM SERVING AS A SAFE HAVEN FOR INTERNATIONAL TERRORISM. THIS COMMITMENT EVOLVED OVER TWENTY YEARS, ENCOMPASSING NATION-BUILDING EFFORTS, COUNTER-INSURGENCY OPERATIONS, AND EXTENSIVE DIPLOMATIC INITIATIVES. THE OBJECTIVE WAS NOT MERELY MILITARY BUT ALSO AIMED AT FOSTERING A STABLE, DEMOCRATIC GOVERNMENT CAPABLE OF GOVERNING ITSELF AND PREVENTING THE RESURGENCE OF EXTREMIST THREATS.

THE COMPLEXITY OF THE AFGHANISTAN US ROLE CANNOT BE OVERSTATED. IT INVOLVED INTRICATE MILITARY OPERATIONS, SUBSTANTIAL ECONOMIC AID, AND SUSTAINED EFFORTS TO BUILD AFGHAN SECURITY FORCES AND GOVERNMENTAL INSTITUTIONS. THE INTERNATIONAL COALITION, LED BY THE US, GRAPPLED WITH A DEEPLY ENTRENCHED INSURGENCY, A CHALLENGING TERRAIN, AND A COMPLEX SOCIO-POLITICAL LANDSCAPE. EXAMINING THIS HISTORICAL ARC PROVIDES CRITICAL INSIGHTS INTO THE SUCCESSES, FAILURES, AND LESSONS LEARNED FROM ONE OF AMERICA'S LONGEST WARS.

INITIAL OBJECTIVES AND THE GENESIS OF THE AFGHANISTAN US ROLE

THE GENESIS OF THE AFGHANISTAN US ROLE WAS A DIRECT RESPONSE TO THE HORRIFIC TERRORIST ATTACKS OF SEPTEMBER 11, 2001. THE AL-QAEDA TERRORIST NETWORK, LED BY OSAMA BIN LADEN, WAS HARBORED BY THE TALIBAN REGIME IN AFGHANISTAN. CONSEQUENTLY, THE IMMEDIATE OBJECTIVE OF THE US INTERVENTION, COMMENCING IN OCTOBER 2001, WAS TO DISMANTLE AL-QAEDA, DISRUPT ITS OPERATIONS, AND REMOVE THE TALIBAN FROM POWER FOR THEIR COMPLICITY. THIS

INITIAL PHASE WAS SWIFT AND LARGELY SUCCESSFUL IN ACHIEVING THESE MILITARY AIMS, ESTABLISHING A NEW INTERIM GOVERNMENT.

HOWEVER, THE INITIAL OBJECTIVES QUICKLY EXPANDED BEYOND COUNTER-TERRORISM. THE US AND ITS ALLIES RECOGNIZED THE NEED TO PREVENT AFGHANISTAN FROM FALLING BACK INTO CHAOS OR BECOMING A HAVEN FOR TERRORISTS ONCE AGAIN. THIS LED TO A BROADER MISSION OF STABILIZATION, RECONSTRUCTION, AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A DEMOCRATIC GOVERNMENT. THE OVERARCHING GOAL WAS TO CREATE A SELF-SUFFICIENT AFGHANISTAN THAT COULD COUNTER INTERNAL THREATS AND CONTRIBUTE TO REGIONAL STABILITY, THEREBY SAFEGUARDING US NATIONAL SECURITY INTERESTS.

THE MILITARY DIMENSION OF THE AFGHANISTAN US ROLE

THE MILITARY DIMENSION OF THE AFGHANISTAN US ROLE WAS ARGUABLY THE MOST VISIBLE AND RESOURCE-INTENSIVE ASPECT OF THE ENGAGEMENT. OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM, LAUNCHED IN 2001, MARKED THE BEGINNING OF A PROTRACTED MILITARY PRESENCE. US FORCES, ALONGSIDE COALITION PARTNERS, ENGAGED IN A WIDE RANGE OF OPERATIONS, FROM DIRECT COMBAT AGAINST THE TALIBAN AND AL-QAEDA TO TRAINING AND ADVISING AFGHAN NATIONAL SECURITY FORCES (ANSF). THE MILITARY STRATEGY EVOLVED OVER TIME, INCORPORATING COUNTER-INSURGENCY TACTICS, SURGE OPERATIONS, AND EVENTUALLY A TRANSITION TO AN AFGHAN-LED SECURITY EFFORT.

KEY MILITARY CONTRIBUTIONS INCLUDED:

- DIRECT COMBAT OPERATIONS AGAINST TERRORIST GROUPS.
- TRAINING AND EQUIPPING THE AFGHAN NATIONAL ARMY AND AFGHAN NATIONAL POLICE.
- PROVIDING LOGISTICAL AND AIR SUPPORT TO AFGHAN FORCES.
- CONDUCTING SPECIAL OPERATIONS MISSIONS.
- ESTABLISHING AND OPERATING MILITARY BASES ACROSS THE COUNTRY.

THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THESE MILITARY EFFORTS WAS OFTEN DEBATED, FACING SIGNIFICANT CHALLENGES SUCH AS THE POROUS BORDER WITH PAKISTAN, THE RESILIENCE OF THE INSURGENCY, AND THE COMPLEX POLITICAL ENVIRONMENT WITHIN AFGHANISTAN. DESPITE SUBSTANTIAL INVESTMENT IN MILITARY HARDWARE AND PERSONNEL, THE GOAL OF FULLY ERADICATING THE INSURGENCY AND CREATING AN ENDURINGLY STABLE SECURITY SITUATION PROVED ELUSIVE.

RECONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT: THE ECONOMIC PILLAR OF THE AFGHANISTAN US ROLE

BEYOND MILITARY OBJECTIVES, THE AFGHANISTAN US ROLE ENCOMPASSED A MASSIVE UNDERTAKING IN RECONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT. RECOGNIZING THAT MILITARY SUCCESS ALONE WOULD NOT GUARANTEE STABILITY, THE US POURED BILLIONS OF DOLLARS INTO REBUILDING AFGHANISTAN'S INFRASTRUCTURE, ECONOMY, AND SOCIAL SERVICES. THIS ECONOMIC PILLAR OF THE US ROLE AIMED TO CREATE A VIABLE AFGHAN STATE CAPABLE OF SUPPORTING ITS POPULATION AND PROVIDING BASIC NECESSITIES, THEREBY REDUCING RELIANCE ON FOREIGN AID AND DIMINISHING THE APPEAL OF INSURGENT NARRATIVES.

MAJOR AREAS OF DEVELOPMENT FOCUS INCLUDED:

- INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS: ROADS, BRIDGES, POWER GRIDS, AND IRRIGATION SYSTEMS WERE PRIORITIZED TO FACILITATE ECONOMIC ACTIVITY AND CONNECTIVITY.
- EDUCATION: SIGNIFICANT INVESTMENT WENT INTO BUILDING SCHOOLS, TRAINING TEACHERS, AND INCREASING ACCESS TO EDUCATION FOR BOYS AND GIRLS, A STARK CONTRAST TO THE TALIBAN'S PREVIOUS POLICIES.
- HEALTHCARE: EFFORTS WERE MADE TO IMPROVE HEALTHCARE FACILITIES, TRAIN MEDICAL PERSONNEL, AND EXPAND ACCESS TO ESSENTIAL MEDICAL SERVICES, PARTICULARLY IN RURAL AREAS.

- **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT:** PROGRAMS WERE DESIGNED TO FOSTER PRIVATE SECTOR GROWTH, CREATE EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES, AND DEVELOP AGRICULTURAL AND INDUSTRIAL SECTORS.
- **GOVERNANCE AND RULE OF LAW:** SUPPORT WAS PROVIDED FOR ESTABLISHING JUDICIAL SYSTEMS, STRENGTHENING PROPERTY RIGHTS, AND COMBATING CORRUPTION.

WHILE SUBSTANTIAL PROGRESS WAS MADE IN MANY OF THESE AREAS, THE SUSTAINABILITY OF THESE DEVELOPMENT GAINS OFTEN DEPENDED ON CONTINUED INTERNATIONAL SUPPORT AND THE INTERNAL STABILITY OF THE AFGHAN GOVERNMENT. CHALLENGES SUCH AS CORRUPTION, SECURITY CONCERNS, AND A LACK OF ABSORPTIVE CAPACITY WITHIN AFGHANISTAN OFTEN HAMPERED THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THESE AID PROGRAMS.

POLITICAL AND GOVERNANCE SUPPORT IN THE AFGHANISTAN US ROLE

A CRUCIAL COMPONENT OF THE AFGHANISTAN US ROLE INVOLVED SUPPORTING THE DEVELOPMENT OF A STABLE, DEMOCRATIC GOVERNMENT. FOLLOWING THE OVERTHROW OF THE TALIBAN, THE US PLAYED A PIVOTAL ROLE IN FACILITATING THE BONN AGREEMENT, WHICH LAID THE GROUNDWORK FOR A NEW POLITICAL DISPENSATION IN AFGHANISTAN. THIS INCLUDED SUPPORTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN INTERIM AUTHORITY, DRAFTING A NEW CONSTITUTION, AND OVERSEEING PRESIDENTIAL AND PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS. THE AIM WAS TO BUILD INSTITUTIONS THAT WERE REPRESENTATIVE, ACCOUNTABLE, AND CAPABLE OF PROVIDING SECURITY AND SERVICES TO THE AFGHAN PEOPLE.

KEY ASPECTS OF POLITICAL AND GOVERNANCE SUPPORT INCLUDED:

- FACILITATING DEMOCRATIC TRANSITIONS THROUGH ELECTIONS.
- PROVIDING TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND CAPACITY BUILDING FOR GOVERNMENT MINISTRIES AND INSTITUTIONS.
- SUPPORTING THE DEVELOPMENT OF A LEGAL FRAMEWORK AND JUDICIAL SYSTEM.
- PROMOTING HUMAN RIGHTS AND THE RULE OF LAW.
- ENGAGING IN DIPLOMATIC EFFORTS TO FOSTER REGIONAL COOPERATION AND SUPPORT FOR AFGHANISTAN.

DESPITE THESE EFFORTS, THE GROWTH OF DEMOCRATIC INSTITUTIONS FACED SIGNIFICANT HURDLES. WIDESPREAD CORRUPTION, POLITICAL INFIGHTING, AND THE PERSISTENT THREAT OF INSURGENCY UNDERMINED THE LEGITIMACY AND EFFECTIVENESS OF THE AFGHAN GOVERNMENT. THE US ROLE OFTEN INVOLVED NAVIGATING COMPLEX INTERNAL AFGHAN POLITICS, BALANCING SUPPORT FOR THE GOVERNMENT WITH PRESSURE FOR REFORMS.

CHALLENGES AND CRITICISMS OF THE AFGHANISTAN US ROLE

THE AFGHANISTAN US ROLE, DESPITE ITS EXPANSIVE AIMS, ENCOUNTERED A MYRIAD OF COMPLEX CHALLENGES AND DREW CONSIDERABLE CRITICISM. THE NATURE OF THE INSURGENCY, ITS DEEP ROOTS, AND ITS ABILITY TO ADAPT PROVED A FORMIDABLE ADVERSARY. THE POROUS DURAND LINE, SHARED WITH PAKISTAN, ALLOWED INSURGENTS TO FIND SAFE HAVENS AND RESUPPLY ROUTES, A PERSISTENT STRATEGIC CHALLENGE. FURTHERMORE, THE INHERENT DIFFICULTIES OF NATION-BUILDING IN A COUNTRY WITH A HISTORY OF TRIBALISM, WEAK CENTRAL AUTHORITY, AND DIVERSE ETHNIC GROUPS ADDED LAYERS OF COMPLEXITY TO THE US MISSION.

COMMON CRITICISMS AND CHALLENGES INCLUDED:

- THE PERCEIVED DISCONNECT BETWEEN MILITARY OBJECTIVES AND POLITICAL REALITIES ON THE GROUND.
- THE EFFECTIVENESS AND OVERSIGHT OF THE VAST AMOUNTS OF AID DISBURSED, WITH CONCERNS ABOUT CORRUPTION AND WASTE.
- THE STRATEGY OF COUNTER-INSURGENCY, WHICH AT TIMES PROVED CONTROVERSIAL AND DIFFICULT TO IMPLEMENT

WITHOUT ALIENATING THE CIVILIAN POPULATION.

- THE LONG-TERM SUSTAINABILITY OF THE AFGHAN SECURITY FORCES AND GOVERNMENT INSTITUTIONS WITHOUT CONTINUED, SUBSTANTIAL EXTERNAL SUPPORT.
- THE UNINTENDED CONSEQUENCES OF CERTAIN US POLICIES, SUCH AS THE RELIANCE ON WARLORDS IN THE EARLY STAGES OF THE INTERVENTION.
- THE IMMENSE FINANCIAL AND HUMAN COST BORNE BY THE UNITED STATES AND ITS ALLIES.

THE TALIBAN'S ABILITY TO ADAPT, REGROUP, AND EXPLOIT POLITICAL AND SECURITY VACUUMS REMAINED A CONSTANT FACTOR, CHALLENGING THE LONG-TERM VIABILITY OF THE US-BACKED GOVERNMENT.

THE SHIFTING SANDS: EVOLUTION AND END OF THE DIRECT AFGHANISTAN US ROLE

THE AFGHANISTAN US ROLE UNDERWENT SIGNIFICANT TRANSFORMATIONS OVER ITS TWO-DECADE DURATION. INITIALLY FOCUSED ON DIRECT MILITARY INTERVENTION AND COUNTER-TERRORISM, THE STRATEGY EVOLVED TO EMPHASIZE TRAINING AND EMPOWERING AFGHAN SECURITY FORCES, WITH THE AIM OF EVENTUAL WITHDRAWAL. THE "SURGE" OF US TROOPS IN 2009 AIMED TO CREATE CONDITIONS FOR A TRANSITION, BUT THE INSURGENCY PERSISTED. OVER TIME, THE US PRESENCE SHIFTED FROM COMBAT OPERATIONS TO A MORE ADVISORY AND SUPPORT ROLE, GRADUALLY HANDING OVER SECURITY RESPONSIBILITIES TO THE ANSF.

THE DECISION TO END THE DIRECT US MILITARY INVOLVEMENT WAS A COMPLEX ONE, INFLUENCED BY VARIOUS FACTORS INCLUDING CHANGING POLITICAL PRIORITIES IN WASHINGTON, THE IMMENSE COSTS INCURRED, AND THE PERCEIVED LACK OF A CLEAR PATH TO DECISIVE VICTORY. THE DOHA AGREEMENT, SIGNED IN FEBRUARY 2020 BETWEEN THE US AND THE TALIBAN, LAID OUT A TIMELINE FOR THE WITHDRAWAL OF US FORCES IN EXCHANGE FOR SECURITY GUARANTEES FROM THE TALIBAN AND THEIR COMMITMENT TO INTRA-AFGHAN PEACE TALKS. THIS AGREEMENT MARKED A SIGNIFICANT TURNING POINT, SIGNALING THE IMPENDING END OF THE DIRECT US MILITARY ROLE.

THE FINAL WITHDRAWAL OF US TROOPS WAS COMPLETED IN AUGUST 2021, FOLLOWING THE COLLAPSE OF THE AFGHAN GOVERNMENT AND THE RAPID TAKEOVER BY THE TALIBAN. THIS MARKED THE END OF A 20-YEAR MILITARY PRESENCE, LEAVING THE FUTURE OF AFGHANISTAN UNCERTAIN AND RAISING CRITICAL QUESTIONS ABOUT THE LEGACY OF THE US INVOLVEMENT.

LONG-TERM IMPLICATIONS OF THE AFGHANISTAN US ROLE

THE LONG-TERM IMPLICATIONS OF THE AFGHANISTAN US ROLE ARE PROFOUND AND CONTINUE TO UNFOLD. THE WITHDRAWAL HAS LED TO A SIGNIFICANT SHIFT IN THE GEOPOLITICAL LANDSCAPE, WITH THE TALIBAN REGAINING CONTROL OF THE COUNTRY. THE FUTURE OF AFGHANISTAN'S GOVERNANCE, HUMAN RIGHTS, AND ECONOMIC STABILITY REMAINS A MAJOR CONCERN. FOR THE UNITED STATES, THE LEGACY OF THIS INVOLVEMENT IS A SUBJECT OF ONGOING DEBATE AND ANALYSIS, WITH LESSONS LEARNED EXPECTED TO INFORM FUTURE FOREIGN POLICY DECISIONS.

KEY LONG-TERM IMPLICATIONS INCLUDE:

- THE RESURGENCE OF THE TALIBAN AND ITS IMPACT ON REGIONAL SECURITY.
- THE HUMANITARIAN CRISIS IN AFGHANISTAN AND THE CHALLENGES OF PROVIDING AID.
- THE UNCERTAIN FUTURE OF WOMEN'S RIGHTS AND MINORITY GROUPS UNDER TALIBAN RULE.
- THE POTENTIAL FOR AFGHANISTAN TO AGAIN BECOME A HAVEN FOR INTERNATIONAL TERRORIST GROUPS.
- THE LASTING ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL IMPACT ON AFGHANISTAN, INCLUDING THE LOSS OF LIFE AND DISPLACEMENT.
- THE FINANCIAL COST TO THE US AND THE DEBATES SURROUNDING THE EFFECTIVENESS OF FOREIGN INTERVENTION.

THE US CONTINUES TO ENGAGE WITH AFGHANISTAN THROUGH DIPLOMATIC CHANNELS AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE, BUT THE NATURE OF ITS ROLE HAS FUNDAMENTALLY CHANGED FROM DIRECT MILITARY AND NATION-BUILDING INVOLVEMENT TO A MORE LIMITED, ALBEIT STILL CONCERNED, ENGAGEMENT.

CONCLUSION: ASSESSING THE AFGHANISTAN US ROLE

IN ASSESSING THE AFGHANISTAN US ROLE, IT IS CLEAR THAT THE ENGAGEMENT WAS CHARACTERIZED BY AMBITIOUS GOALS, SIGNIFICANT CHALLENGES, AND A COMPLEX LEGACY. FROM ITS INITIAL OBJECTIVE OF COMBATING TERRORISM AFTER 9/11, THE US MISSION EXPANDED TO INCLUDE EXTENSIVE MILITARY OPERATIONS, NATION-BUILDING EFFORTS, AND THE PROMOTION OF DEMOCRATIC GOVERNANCE. BILLIONS OF DOLLARS WERE INVESTED, AND COUNTLESS LIVES WERE IMPACTED ON ALL SIDES. WHILE SOME MILESTONES WERE ACHIEVED, SUCH AS THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A NEW CONSTITUTION AND DEMOCRATIC ELECTIONS, THE ULTIMATE GOAL OF CREATING A SELF-SUSTAINING, STABLE, AND SECURE AFGHANISTAN FREE FROM EXTREMIST THREATS PROVED ELUSIVE.

THE WITHDRAWAL OF US FORCES IN 2021 MARKED THE END OF AMERICA'S LONGEST WAR, LEAVING BEHIND A NATION GRAPPLING WITH PROFOUND POLITICAL, ECONOMIC, AND HUMANITARIAN CHALLENGES UNDER TALIBAN RULE. THE AFGHANISTAN US ROLE SERVES AS A CRITICAL CASE STUDY IN MODERN COUNTER-INSURGENCY, NATION-BUILDING, AND THE COMPLEXITIES OF INTERNATIONAL INTERVENTION, OFFERING VALUABLE, ALBEIT OFTEN PAINFUL, LESSONS FOR FUTURE FOREIGN POLICY ENDEAVORS.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHAT IS THE CURRENT OFFICIAL STANCE OF THE US REGARDING ITS ROLE IN AFGHANISTAN AFTER THE WITHDRAWAL?

THE OFFICIAL US STANCE IS THAT THE MILITARY WITHDRAWAL IS COMPLETE, AND THE FOCUS HAS SHIFTED TO HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE, COUNTER-TERRORISM EFFORTS AGAINST GROUPS LIKE ISIS-K, AND DIPLOMATIC ENGAGEMENT WITH THE TALIBAN TO PROMOTE STABILITY AND PROTECT HUMAN RIGHTS.

WHAT ARE THE MAIN HUMANITARIAN CHALLENGES FACING AFGHANISTAN CURRENTLY, AND WHAT ROLE IS THE US PLAYING?

AFGHANISTAN FACES SEVERE HUMANITARIAN CHALLENGES INCLUDING WIDESPREAD POVERTY, FOOD INSECURITY, AND A COLLAPSED ECONOMY. THE US IS A MAJOR PROVIDER OF HUMANITARIAN AID, WORKING THROUGH INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS AND NGOS TO DELIVER FOOD, MEDICAL SUPPLIES, AND OTHER ESSENTIAL ASSISTANCE, WHILE NAVIGATING SANCTIONS AND ENSURING AID REACHES THOSE IN NEED WITHOUT DIRECTLY SUPPORTING THE TALIBAN.

HOW IS THE US ADDRESSING THE COUNTER-TERRORISM THREAT EMANATING FROM AFGHANISTAN POST-WITHDRAWAL?

THE US MAINTAINS A "OVER-THE-HORIZON" COUNTER-TERRORISM CAPABILITY, RELYING ON INTELLIGENCE AND DRONE OPERATIONS TO MONITOR AND DISRUPT TERRORIST GROUPS LIKE AL-QAEDA AND ISIS-K IN AFGHANISTAN. THE FOCUS IS ON PREVENTING AFGHANISTAN FROM BECOMING A SAFE HAVEN FOR TERRORISM WITHOUT DEPLOYING TROOPS ON THE GROUND.

WHAT IS THE US APPROACH TO ENGAGING WITH THE TALIBAN GOVERNMENT IN AFGHANISTAN?

THE US DOES NOT OFFICIALLY RECOGNIZE THE TALIBAN GOVERNMENT. ENGAGEMENT IS LIMITED AND PRAGMATIC, PRIMARILY FOCUSED ON SECURITY CONCERNS (LIKE COUNTER-TERRORISM), HUMANITARIAN AID DELIVERY, AND ADVOCATING FOR INCLUSIVE GOVERNANCE AND RESPECT FOR HUMAN RIGHTS, PARTICULARLY FOR WOMEN AND GIRLS. DIPLOMATIC PRESENCE IS OFTEN CONDUCTED REMOTELY OR THROUGH INTERMEDIARIES.

WHAT ARE THE LONG-TERM IMPLICATIONS OF THE US WITHDRAWAL ON REGIONAL STABILITY AND US FOREIGN POLICY?

THE US WITHDRAWAL HAS HAD SIGNIFICANT IMPLICATIONS FOR REGIONAL STABILITY, POTENTIALLY CREATING POWER VACUUMS AND IMPACTING NEIGHBORING COUNTRIES' SECURITY. IT HAS ALSO PROMPTED A RE-EVALUATION OF US FOREIGN POLICY STRATEGIES, PARTICULARLY CONCERNING NATION-BUILDING AND THE LIMITS OF MILITARY INTERVENTION, AND HAS INFLUENCED DISCUSSIONS ABOUT THE US ROLE IN OTHER COMPLEX GEOPOLITICAL REGIONS.

HOW ARE HUMAN RIGHTS, ESPECIALLY WOMEN'S RIGHTS, BEING ADDRESSED IN THE CONTEXT OF THE US'S ONGOING ROLE IN AFGHANISTAN?

THE US CONSISTENTLY ADVOCATES FOR THE PROTECTION OF HUMAN RIGHTS AND FUNDAMENTAL FREEDOMS IN AFGHANISTAN, WITH A PARTICULAR EMPHASIS ON WOMEN AND GIRLS. WHILE DIRECT LEVERAGE IS REDUCED POST-WITHDRAWAL, THE US USES DIPLOMATIC PRESSURE, SANCTIONS, AND HUMANITARIAN AID CONDITIONS TO URGE THE TALIBAN TO RESPECT THESE RIGHTS AND TO SUPPORT CIVIL SOCIETY ORGANIZATIONS WORKING ON THESE ISSUES.
