IT'S LIKE TRYING TO UNDERSTAND THE RIPPLE EFFECT IN A POND WHEN MULTIPLE STONES ARE DROPPED SIMULTANEOUSLY.

A: WHILE AGRICULTURAL POLICY ANALYSIS CANNOT PREDICT THE FUTURE WITH ABSOLUTE CERTAINTY DUE TO INHERENT UNCERTAINTIES IN AGRICULTURAL SYSTEMS AND EXTERNAL FACTORS, IT CAN PROVIDE STRONG INDICATIONS OF LIKELY OUTCOMES BASED ON AVAILABLE DATA, ESTABLISHED RELATIONSHIPS, AND MODELING. IT AIMS TO MINIMIZE RISKS AND MAXIMIZE THE PROBABILITY OF SUCCESS.

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
